**I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:**

**Tropical Storm "NONA" has slowed while maintaining its strength and direction.**

<b>Location of Center: (as of 10:00 AM)</b>	<b>1,025 km East of Maasin City, Southern Leyte</b>
<b>Coordinates:</b>	<b>10.4°N, 134.2°E</b>
<b>Strength:</b>	Maximum sustained winds of <b>65 kph</b> near the center and gustiness of up to <b>80 kph</b> .
<b>Movement:</b>	Forecast to move West Northwest at <b>17 kph</b>
<b>Forecast Positions/Outlook:</b>	<i>Tomorrow morning:</i> <b>605 km East of Borongan City, Eastern Samar</b>  <i>Monday morning:</i> <b>350 km East of Sorsogon City, Sorsogon</b>  <i>Tuesday morning:</i> <b>Vicinity of Virac, Catanduanes</b>  <i>Wednesday morning:</i> <b>55 km Northeast of Calapan City, Oriental Mindoro</b>  <i>Thursday morning:</i> <b>195 km West of Calapan City, Oriental Mindoro</b>
<b>NO PUBLIC STORM WARNING SIGNAL</b>	

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 100 km diameter of the Tropical Storm.
- It is possible to raise PSWS #1 over Bicol Region and Samar provinces by tomorrow morning.

- The public and the disaster risk reduction and management council concerned are advised to take appropriate actions and watch for the next Severe Weather Bulletin to be issued at **11:00 PM** today.

## II. ACTION/S TAKEN

- **NDRRMC Operations Center** disseminated **Severe Weather Bulletin No. 02 re Tropical Storm "NONA" (I.N. MELOR)** to all OCD Regional Centers through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local disaster risk reduction and management councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels
  - Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants
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
