#### I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

- **CARINA HAS MADE LANDFALL OVER CABUTUNAN POINT AND IS NOW TRAVERSING NORTHERN CAGAYAN.**
- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within 500 km diameter of the Severe Tropical Storm.
- Fisher folk are alerted against rough to very rough seas over the Northern **Eastern** and Southern seaboard of Luzon.
- Areas under TCWS # 1 and #2, **CALABARZON**, MIMAROPA, the rest of Central and of Northern Luzon and the provinces of **Camarines** are alerted against moderate to heavy rains which may trigger flashfloods and landslides.
- TS “Carina” is expected to **exit the Northwestern part of Cagayan tonight.**
- At 1:00 PM today, the center of severe tropical Storm “Carina” was estimated based on all available data **70 km East of Tuguegarao City, Cagayan (17.9°N, 122.3°E).**
- TS “Carina” has maximum sustained winds of up to 95kph near the centered and gustiness of up to 120kph.
- Forecast to move **West Northwest at 20kph.**
- The Typhoon is expected to be at **310 km Northwest of Laoag City, Ilocos Norte (Outside PAR)** by tomorrow morning. By Tuesday morning, it is expected to be at **910 km West Northwest of Itbayat, Batanes (Outside PAR).** By

Wednesday morning, it is expected to be at **1,475 km** West Northwest of Itbayat, Batanes (Outside PAR).

- The public and disaster risk reduction and management councils concerned are advised to take appropriate actions and watch for the next weather bulletin to be issued at **5PM today**.

## II. ACTIONS TAKEN

- NDRRMC Operations Center disseminated **Severe Weather Bulletin No. 17 for Tropical Storm "Carina"** to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
  - Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and mountainous areas if situations warrants.
