## **NDRRMC UPDATE**

### **I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:**

- **CARINA HAS MAINTAINED ITS STRENGTH WHILE TRAVERSING NORTHERN CAGAYAN.**
- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 500 km diameter of the Severe Tropical Storm.
- Fisher folk are alerted against rough to very rough seas over the Northern Eastern and Southern seaboards of Luzon.
- Areas under TCWS # 1 and #2, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA and the rest of Central Luzon are alerted against moderate to heavy rains which may trigger flash floods and landslides.
- **STS** “Carina” is expected to exit the Northwestern part of Cagayan tonight.
- At 4:00 PM today, the center of severe tropical Storm “Carina” was estimated based on all available data **30 km South of Apari, Cagayan (18.1°N, 121.6°E).**
- **STS** “Carina” has maximum sustained winds of up to 95kph near the center and gustiness of up to 120kph.
- Forecast to move **Northwest at 20kph.**
- The Typhoon is expected to be at **420 km West of Itbayat, Batanes** (Outside PAR) by tomorrow morning. By Tuesday morning, it is expected to be at **970 km West Northwest of Itbayat, Batanes** (Outside PAR).

- The public and disaster risk reduction and management councils concerned are advised to take appropriate actions and watch for the next weather bulletin to be issued at **8 PM today**.

## II. ACTIONS TAKEN

- NDRRMC Operations Center disseminated **Severe Weather Bulletin No. 18 for Tropical Storm "Carina"** to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
  - Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and mountainous areas if situations warrants.
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
