I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

TYPHOON "FERDIE" HAS INTENSIFIED FURTHER AS IT CONTINUES TO MOVE IN A WEST-NORTHWEST DIRECTION.

Location of Center: (as of 10:00PM)	1,145 km East of Casiguran, Aurora (17.5° N, 132.8°E)
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of up to 140 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 170 kph
Movement:	Forecast to move West Northwest at 22 kph .
Forecast Positions/Outlook:	24 Hour (Tomorrow evening): 705 km East Northeast of Casiguran, Aurora 48 Hour (Tuesday evening): 80 km East of Basco, Batanes 72 Hour (Wednesday evening): 480 km West Northwest of Itbayat, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) 96 Hour (Thursday evening): 800 km Northwest of Itbayat, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR)

NO TROPICAL CYCLONE WARNING SIGNAL

- The public and the disaster risk reduction and management council concerned are advised to take appropriate actions and watch for the next weather bulletin to be issued at **11:00 AM tomorrow or earlier**.

II. ACTION/S TAKEN

- **NDRRM Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin No. 02 re Severe Tropical Storm "FERDIE" (I.N. MERANTI)** to all OCD Regional Centers through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local disaster risk reduction and management councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels
 - Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants.
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
