I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

TYPHOON "FERDIE" IS NOW OUTSIDE THE PHILIPPINE AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY (PAR).

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 600 km diameter of the Typhoon. All Tropical Cyclone Warning Signals are now lifted. 	
Location of Center: (as of 4:00 PM)	400 km Northwest of Basco, Batanes (23.0° N, 119.3°E) OUTSIDE PAR
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of up to 175 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 210 kph
Movement:	Forecast to move Northwest at 20 kph
Forecast Positions/Outlook:	24 Hour (Tomorrow afternoon): 770 km North Northwest of Itbayat, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) 48 Hour (Friday afternoon): 995 km North Northwest of Itbayat, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR)

II. ACTION/S TAKEN

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin No. 19 (FINAL) re Typhoon "FERDIE" (I.N. MERANTI) to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local disaster risk reduction and management councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels**
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants.
