- The Rapid Damaged Assessment and Needs Analysis (RDANA) Team of the RDRRMC Region II in Cagayan is still on standby since September 15, 2016, awaiting the C-130 aircraft from Villamor Airbase to transport them to Basco and Itbayat, Batanes.

Status of Displaced Families / Persons

To date, there were **2,710 families** or **10,344 persons** who have been displaced in Regions I and II; of which, **20 families** or **151 persons** stayed in **three (3) evacuation centers** in the municipality of Basco, Batanes; while **2,651 families** or **10,063 persons** temporarily took shelter with their relatives and friends.

Food and Non-Food Items

Level of Stockpile and Standby Funds

The DSWD Central Office, DSWD Field Offices I & II, and NROC have a total stockpile and standby funds amounting to **₱1,045,093,663.71** as of 17 September 2016 6AM with breakdown as follows:

a. Standby Funds

The Central Office and affected FOs have a total standby fund of **₱806,841,491.62**. Of the said amount, **₱797,445,021.62** is available for Quick Response Fund by the CO.

b. Stockpiles

There is also a total of **164,218** Family Food Packs (FFPs) amounting to **₱61,335,271.04** and available Food and Non-Food Items (FNFI) amounting to **₱176,916,901.05**.

Note: On-going repacking of FFPs in Regions with below 30,000 level of FFPs

- As of September 16, 2016 the DSWD Field Office II has repositioned 350 sacks of NFA Rice at the PSWDO-Batanes and;
- The Field Office II is continuously repacking food packs to be repositioned in all strategic locations in Isabela, Cagayan and Aparri.
- NROO is on standby and awaiting the schedule of C130 to load and airlift the following goods to Basco, Batanes:
 - a. 20,000 pcs. RTEF Brown Rice Bars;
 - b. 5,000 pcs. Malong (wrap around, tube cloth);
 - c. 800 FFPs;
 - d. 5,000 bottled water;
 - e. 1 Generator Set;
 - f. 30 rolls of laminated sacks
 - g. 70 boxes of corned beef



Search, Rescue and Retrieval

- September 15, 2016, Activation of SRR cluster off-site (One Tagaytay Hotel)
- As of September 15, 2016, No reported request for Search and Rescue and Retrieval



Emergency Telecommunications

- Activation of ETC cluster off-site (One Tagaytay Hotel)
- Two (2) Regional Rapid Emergency Telecommunication Teams (RETT) on standby alert for deployment to Batanes composed of OCD-RII, DOST,17IB and 5ID, Phil Army.
- Satellite Phone System at OCDROs are on standby alert
- Directed the OCDROs to utilize the Mobile Application of “Batingaw” for information dissemination and status updates
- ERIC deployed personnel in the Response Cluster Off-Site Operation Center in One Tagaytay Place Hotel, Tagaytay City and at NDRRMC, Camp Aguinaldo, Q.C.
- Deployed systems to aid integration of reports, actions and resolution in NDRRMC Response Cluster:
 - responseops.ph – collaboration platform*
 - eric-ims – incident management system*
 - drr-sitrep – situation report consolidation*
- AFP sent radio operator in the NDRRMC Operation Center to establish contact in Batanes through HF Radio in PAGASA BASCO Station.
- DSWD sent satphone unit together with the relief team and alerted all DRTs, SWAD Team, 4Ds and KCC personnel at the local level for possible deployment



HEALTH CLUSTER:

- Activation of Response Cluster off-site (One Tagaytay Hotel);
- Coordinated with DReAMB-DSWD, DOH, and OCD-ROII for the deployment of Relief, Medical, RDANA Teams;
- Coordinated with Logistics Cluster through OJ3, AFP regarding the availability of appropriate aircraft to transport Relief, Medical, RDANA Teams and Relief Goods to Basco and Itbayat, Batanes and;
- Coordinated with Manila Water for the availability of bottled water and mobile water treatment
- Augmented Medicines, Aquatabs, Jerrycans and Anti-Tetanus to PHO Batanes worth Php 322,743.50

LOGISTICS CLUSTER:

- One (1) C130 prepared to fly from Villamor Airbase to Batanes province to deliver relief goods, medical supplies, communication equipment and thirty-eight (38) personnel.
- DOE coordinated with National Electrification Administration (NEA) to address the power outage in province of Batanes.
- NEA has activated its "Task Force Kapatid" where Electric Cooperatives (ECs) are advised to install lines, cables, posts for the immediate power restoration.
- Coordinated with the DPWH Batanes Engineering District for the conduct of clearing operation at km 18+600 along Basco-Mahatao-Ivana-Uyugan-Imnajbu Road.
- Coordinated with concerned offices of the DOE relating to power and oil to address the power outage in Batanes.
- Coordinated with DSWD-DReAMB, DOH, and OCDRO II to transport Relief, Medical supplies, RDANA Teams to Basco and Itbayat, Batanes.
- Coordinated with CAAP regarding availability of commercial flight to Basco, Batanes.
- No commercial flights yet due to problems with communication at Basco Airport.
- Coordinated with OJ3, AFP for the provision of M35 Trucks to transport 2,000 pcs. Bottled water from Maynilad, Balara, QC to Villamor Airbase
- Coordinated with OJ3 - AFP on the status of C130 and C295 flights to Basco and Itbayat. Per information from OJ3 – AFP flight to Batanes is indefinite due to prevailing bad weather
- DOH has two Medical Teams on standby for deployment 1 - DOH ERT (6, doctors, 6 nurses) 1- AFP (1 doctor, 1 nurse, 2 emts) with assorted medicines and medical supplies > A total of 1.2 M worth of prepositioned logistics (medicines and medical supplies) in Region II
- Already coordinated with National Electrification Administration c/o Usec. M.C. Capongcol. information given: NEA has already activated its "Task Force Kapatid" where Electric Cooperatives (ECs) are already alerted to handle the matter ASAP re: lines, cables, posts for the immediate power restoration. In case, NEA needs aircraft requirement, the same shall be coordinated with the AFP.

EDUCATION CLUSTER

- Class Suspensions as of September 16, 2016, Batanes (Region 2), in all Levels
- Prepositioned learning kits (2,887), teaching kits (50), and book library kits (150 sets) c/o UNICEF;
- Standby-funds available for setting up of Temporary Learning Spaces (TLS) and support for school clean-up;
- Coordinated with the affected regional and division DRRM coordinators of DEPED Region 1, 2 and CAR to submit report on rapid assessment of damages report (RADaR).

- As of September 16, 27 schools reported damages to facilities. These damage are for validation and technical assessment of engineers;
- Coordinated with regional and division DRRM coordinators DEPED Region 1, 2 and CAR to validate and send reports of class suspensions and schools used as evacuation centers;
- Disseminated weather advisories, updates, SitReps to the key officials and DRRM Coordinators of regions and divisions in the exposed areas via INFOboard text blast and email and;
- Disseminated information to regional and division DRRM Coordinators of exposed areas the list of areas with possible greater than 100mm rainfall and the list of areas with possible debris flow;
- Coordinated with Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM) Cluster for the Diptan elementary school in Basco, Batanes used as evacuation center with 96 individuals.

Philippine International Humanitarian Assistance Cluster

- Drafted fax message to all Foreign Service Post on the status of the Typhoon and mentioning that there's still no need to request for international humanitarian assistance

General Coordination

1. Response **Cluster Leads** shall consolidate all reports of their members and submit the same to the Response Cluster Secretariat. **Individual agency report will not be accepted.**
2. Activities of the Response Pillar are being coordinated by the Office of Civil Defense (OCD) Operations Division and the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD).
3. Cluster Leads are required to detail a senior officer in the NDRRMC OpCen to render a 24/7 basis duty.
