### Camp Coordination and Camp Management and Protection

A total of **2,710 families** or **10,344 persons** were affected in **3 provinces, 6 municipalities** and **16 barangays** of Regions I and II.

The Relief Mission Team, consisting of Rapid Damage Assessment (RDNA) Team, Rapid Emergency Telecommunications Team (RETT), and Health Emergency Management (HEM) Team from the NDRRMC and RDRRMC Region –II were deployed to conduct damage and needs assessment, provide emergency telecommunications and emergency health services. The Team on board a Philippine Air Force C-130 that left Villamor Airbase on 17 September 2016 at 1230H carrying relief from DSWD was successfully transported/ airlifted for distribution to the affected families.

September 18, 2016, DSWD Assistant Secretary Hope Hervilla with Asst. Bureau Director Carlos Padolina arrived in Basco, Batanes at 8:31am via C295 to further determine the needs of the affected families and then the team headed by Usec Jalad of OCD accompanied by Gov. Cayco and Cong. Abad were airlifted by C295 to Itbayat bringing 20 sacks of rice, 4 boxes of distilled water and 20 assorted boxes containing canned goods and family food packs as well as assorted medical supplies and medicines.

### Status of Displaced Families / Persons

To date, there were **2,710 families** or **10,344 persons** have been displaced in Regions I and II; of which, **20 families** or **151 persons** are still inside the **three (3) evacuation centers** in the municipality of Basco, Batanes; while **2,651 families** or **10,063 persons** are temporarily taking shelter with their relatives and friends.

## Food and Non-Food Items

### Level of Stockpile and Standby Funds

The DSWD Central Office, DSWD Field Offices I, II, CAR and NROC have a total stockpile and standby funds amounting to **₱1,038,858,272.16** as of 18 September 2016 6AM with breakdown as follows:

#### a. Standby Funds

The Central Office and affected FOs have a total standby fund of **₱806,841,491.62**. Of these, **₱797,445,021.62** is available for Quick Response Fund by the CO.

#### b. Stockpiles

There is also a total of **155,248** Family Food Packs (FFPs) amounting to **₱58,584,217.04** and available Food and Non-Food Items (FNFI) amounting to **₱173,432,563.50**

- DSWD-NDRRMC Relief Mission Team airlifted the following items via C130 to Basco, Batanes:
  - a. 20,000 pcs. RTEF Brown Rice Bars;
  - b. 5,000 pcs. Malong (wrap around, tube cloth);
  - c. 600 FFPs;
  - d. 1 Generator Set
  - e. 5,000 bottles drinking water (350 ml)
- The Field Office II is continuously repacking food packs to be prepositioned in all strategic locations in Isabel, Cagayan and Aparri. Further, 130 sacks of rice has been prepositioned in the Province of Batanes, to wit:

- Aside from the relief goods indicated above, DSWD thru C130 airlifted at 10:30 this morning, 18 September 2016, 200 boxes of corned beef intended for Basco affected families while the generator set is for the use in Itbayat, all in the Province of Batanes, in response to some of the recommendations of the RDNA Team.
- The recently conducted Rapid Damage and Needs Assessment (RDNA)

identified the need to further augment food items and non-food items including candles for use of the affected families.

- Directed the OCDROs to utilize the Mobile Application “Batingaw” for information dissemination and status updates.

##### **PROVINCIAL HEALTH OFFICE (PHO) OF BATANES**

- Nurse Deployment Project (NDP) and Rural Health Midwife Placement Program (RHMP) staff are deployed to health facilities to assist in the provision of medical services and support in the assessment of damaged incurred by health facilities in Batanes.
- Conducted barangay assemblies focusing on food and water safety and strategies for vector control

##### **BATANES GENERAL HOSPITAL**

- Prepared 500 vials of Tetanus Toxoid and 300 Anti-Tetanus Serum vaccines for distribution of PHO to Rural Health Units (RHUs)

#### **DAMAGED HEALTH FACILITIES:**

- There were three (3) partially damaged health facilities, estimated cost of damaged per health facility are as follows: Batanes General Hospital (PhP

10,200,000.00), Basco Rural Health Unit (PhP 180,000.00), and BHS Uyugan (cost to be determined).

- ✓ All aforementioned partially damaged health facilities are functional.
- ✓ Request of immediately rehabilitation of partially damaged health facilities is solicited by the provincial government of Batanes.
- PHO is requesting generator sets for the storage of vaccines. Currently the vaccines are lodged at the NAPOCOR for safe storage.

### LOGISTICAL SUPPORT

- A total of PhP 720,367.54 worth of logistics was provided to the province of Batanes as part of the response operations of the Health Cluster as of September 18, 2016.

### LOGISTICS CLUSTER:

In the meantime, DOE requested National Electrification Administration (NEA) to coordinate with NPC-SPUG's newly 3x600kW Gensets be used temporarily to power the community facilities and streetlights.

Task Force Kapatid will be formed thru Region 2 Electric Cooperatives Association which will be composed of linemen and technical manpower of ECAs not affected by Typhoon Ferdie and will be deployed to Batanes to help accelerate the restoration of damaged facilities.



NEA to supervise the restoration activity once the construction and power line materials are available.

General Manager of BATANELCO is scheduled to coordinate with NEA Main Office to discuss the funding requirements for the rehabilitation/restoration of damage facilities.

## General Coordination

1. Response **Cluster Leads** shall consolidate all reports of their members and submit the same to the Response Cluster Secretariat. **Individual agency report will not be accepted.**
2. Activities of the Response Pillar are being coordinated by the Office of Civil Defense (OCD) Operations Division and the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD).
3. Cluster Leads are required to detail a senior officer in the NDRRMC OpCen to render a 24/7 basis duty.

## Photos from the NDRRMC Response Cluster Relief Mission on 18 September 2016

### DSWD Response Updates

18 September 2016 at 0831H, DSWD Assistant Secretary Hope Hervilla with Asst. Bureau Director Carlos Padolina together with Usec Jalad arrived in Basco, Batanes via C295 to further determine the needs of the affected families. The team headed by Usec Jalad of OCD and Asec Hervilla of DSWD accompanied by Gov. Cayco and Cong. Abad were airlifted by C295 to Itbayat bringing 20 sacks of rice, 4 boxes of distilled water, 20 assorted boxes containing canned goods and family food packs as well as assorted medical supplies, medicines and genset.



Per updates from ABD Padolina, he noted that: “The Team was able to conduct initial assessment. Most of damages were houses, electric posts, school buildings, crops and livestock and agricultural products such as bananas and coconut trees.

The Itbayat municipal assessment initially cost the damages amounting to 64.7M.

As per recommendation of the local government of Itbayat, immediately they are in need of shelter assistance such ropes and tarps, candles, food and water. The provincial government will try to deliver these request thru airlift starting today and tomorrow.

This morning the DSWD NROO was able to airlift 200 boxes of corned beef and generator set to fulfill the recommendation made in the meeting between the Provincial Government and the NDRRMC response cluster yesterday.

Batanes provincial government also submitted to DSWD Asec Hope their initial assessment amounted to Php 369,954,461.00.”

17 September 2016, the NDRRMC Response Cluster Relief Mission in Basco, Batanes was successfully conducted. At 1230H 17 September 2016, the Relief Mission Team on board a Philippine Air Force C-130 left Villamor Airbase, carrying relief items consisting of 600 Family Food Packs (FFPs), 20,000 ready to eat food (RTEF) brown rice bars, bottled water, malongs, and generator sets.







At 1515H 17 September 2016, the relief items were safely airlifted and delivered to the Province of Batanes for distribution to the affected families. The Relief Mission Team, consisting of Rapid Damage and Needs Assessment (RDANA) Team, Rapid Emergency Telecommunications Team (RETT), and Health Emergency Management (HEM) Team from the NDRRMC and RDRRMC Region II were also deployed to conduct damage and needs assessment, provide emergency telecommunications and emergency health services.

Provincial Governor Marilou Cayco presented the situation updates and immediate needs. They still need canned goods, ropes for securing their houses, and emergency communication. As of this reporting time, Itbayat remains isolated and without communications. A facsimile of the provincial declaration of state of calamity was furnished to the mission lead. Cong. Dina Abad, who accompanied the relief flight, also brought in water purification systems. Cellular communication is intermittent and very weak. Fuel is still available in Basco, Batanes.
