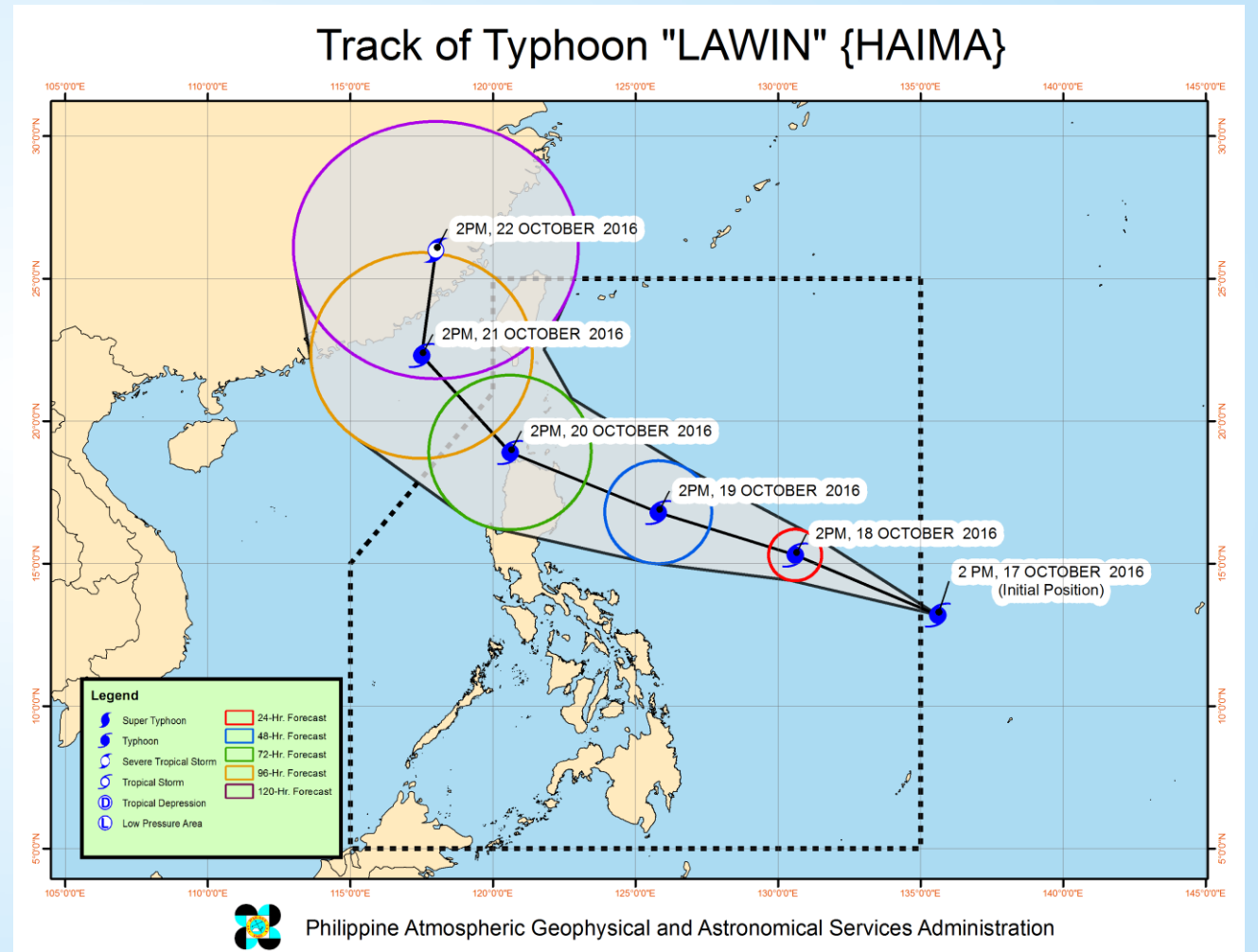

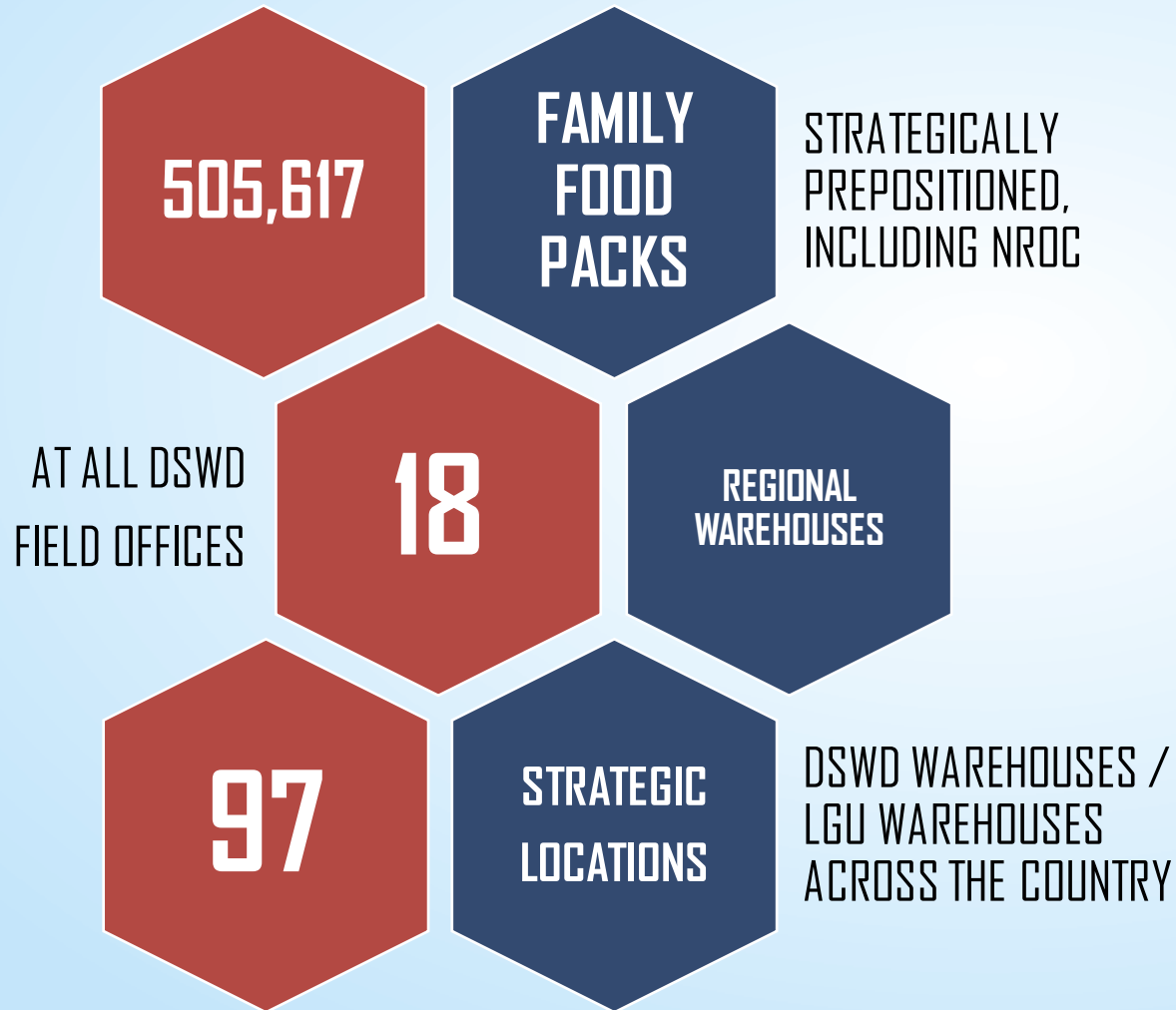

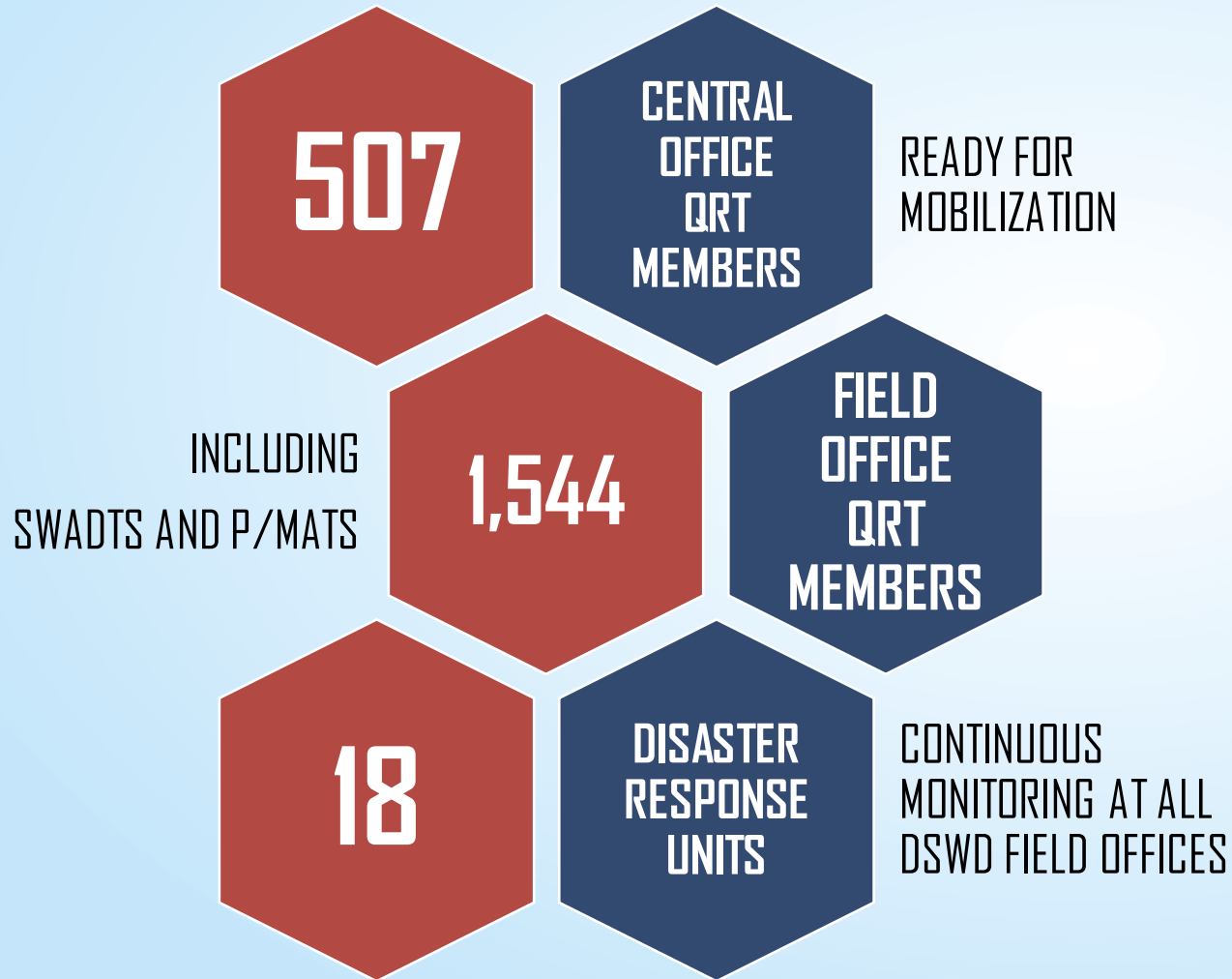

REGION	SITUATION UPDATES
I	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The DSWD-Field Office (FO) I is closely monitoring the track of Typhoon “LAWIN” while the Social Welfare Action Development Team (SWADT) is currently coordinating with the P/M/CSWDO on the preparedness measures of their respective areas. • The Regional Disaster Risk Reduction Management Council of Response Cluster had an emergency meeting on the preparedness measures with the following concerns: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The FO has a ready stockpile of relief goods with a total of 28,728 family food packs. Out of the said stockpile, they have prepositioned goods to 12 satellite warehouses on strategic locations that nearby LGUs can easily access. Likewise, they have prepositioned Ready to Eat Rice Tuna, Bottled Mineral water, and laminated sacks for evacuees in the Provinces of La Union, Pangasinan, Ilocos Sur and Ilocos Norte. • Relative to this, regular inventory as well as inspection of the DSWD Warehouse Manager is being conducted to ensure that the goods are not expired and spoiled. • DSWD Field Office I has a standby fund of Php 3,209,812.00 for the emergency purchase of relief goods

REGION	SITUATION UPDATES
II	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The FO has an available standby funds of Php 3,209,850.00 • There are available 10,370 Family Food Packs (FFPs) at the Field Office Warehouse on top of the prepositioned 12,900 FFPs and 3,696 pieces of ready-to-eat foods (RTEF) in the municipalities of Cagayan & Isabela. The replenishment of prepositioned goods for the municipalities of Divilacan and Maconacon in the province of Isabea are to be delivered this morning at the Sta. Ana port. These goods will be in preparation for the incoming Typhoon "LAWIN". • The FO has been continuously coordinating with the RDRRMC. • The Disaster Monitoring and Response Team of the Field Office and the Provincial and City/Municipal Action Teams of the provinces of Cagayan, Isabela, Nueva Vizcaya and Quirino are still on duty to monitor the effects of Typhoon "KAREN" and are now preparing for the incoming Typhoon "LAWIN". • The FO is requesting for additional stockpile of FFPs and bottled water for immediate augmentation to the LGUs.
