I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

Tropical Storm "KAREN" continues to intensify as it moves closer to Catanduanes – Camarines Sur area.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 400 km diameter of the Tropical Storm Possible raising of Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal #1 over Bulacan, Nueva Ecija, and Nueva Vizcaya this afternoon Fisherfolks and those with small seacrafts are advised not to venture out over the eastern seaboard of Eastern Samar

				<ul style="list-style-type: none"> may be partially or totally unroofed. Some old galvanized iron (G. I.) roofs may be peeled or blown off Some wooden, old electric posts are tilted or downed Some damage to poorly constructed signs/billboards In general, the winds may bring light to moderate damage to the exposed communities. Most banana plants, a few mango trees, ipil-ipil and similar types of trees are downed or broken Some coconut trees may be tilted with few others broken Rice and corn may be adversely affected Considerable damage to shrubbery and trees with some heavy-foliaged trees blown down

Some banana plants are tilted, a few downed and leaves are generally damaged Twigs of small tree may be broken Rice crops, however, may suffer significant damage when it is in its flowering stage

II. ACTIONS TAKEN

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated **Severe Weather Bulletin No. 06 for Tropical Storm "KAREN"** to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Offices to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and mountainous areas if situations warrants.
