I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

Typhoon "KAREN" has maintained its strength and is about to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility.

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within **500 km** diameter of the typhoon.
- Fisherfolks and those with small seacrafts are advised not to venture out over the seaboards of Northern Luzon and the western seaboard of Central Luzon.
- Typhoon "KAREN" is expected to exit PAR tonight **or early morning tomorrow**.
- Meanwhile at **8:00 PM** today, the **Typhoon** with international name "HAIMA" was located at **1,500 km** East of Visayas (**11.2°N, 138.7°E**). It is expected to enter the eastern boundary of the PAR tomorrow afternoon (**17 October 2016**).

- The public and the disaster risk reduction and management councils (DRRMCs) concerned are advised to take appropriate actions and watch for the next weather bulletin to be issued at **11:00 AM tomorrow or earlier**.

II. ACTIONS TAKEN

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated **Severe Weather Bulletin No. 22 for Typhoon "KAREN"** to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRM website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
 - Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Offices to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and mountainous areas if situations warrants.
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
