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## FOOD AND NON-FOOD ITEMS CLUSTER

### Status of Prepositioned Resources: Stockpile and Standby Funds

The Central Office (CO), affected Field Offices (FOs) and National Resource Operations Center (NROC) have a total stockpile and standby funds amounting to **₱879,028,358.69**

### Assistance Provided

DSWD REGION V

DSWD cost of assistance amounts to Php 206,358,416.38 equivalent to 580,857 FFPs, 2,459 ready to eat meals, 1,585 malong, 885 plastic mats, 885 mosquito net, 885 blankets and 585 dignity kit on top of prepositioned goods amounting Php 9,333,760 or 29,600 FFPs in 27 Local Government Units.

### Logistics

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### CAMP COORDINATION AND CAMP MANAGEMENT

#### Pre-emptive Evacuation

Pre-emptive evacuation was done in **Regions V** and **VIII**. A total of **4,614 families** or **18,382 persons** have pre-emptively evacuated. Of which, **3,518 families** or **13,984 persons** are currently staying in **65 evacuation centers** while **250 persons** or **1,014 families** chose to stay with relatives or friends.



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### EMERGENCY TELECOMMUNICATIONS

#### OCD

- Activated the Emergency Telecommunications Cluster (ETC) effective 251500H December 2016
- Regional Rapid Emergency Telecommunication Teams (RETT) in Regions III, MIMAROPA, CALABARZON, V, VI, and VIII were activated and on standby alert
- Satellite Phone System at the OCDROs are on standby alert
- Directed the OCDROs to utilize the Mobile Application “Batingaw” for information dissemination and status updates
- Disseminated warning information about Typhoon NINA (NOCK-TEN) to general public through telecommunication companies using emergency broadcast system
- 

#### OCD III/ RDRRMC III

- On 23 December 2016, alerted and activated the Regional Response Cluster, Regional IMT and Regional RETT to monitor the progress of Typhoon NINA.
- 7ID, PA – 703<sup>rd</sup> Brigade to install HF radio communication at OCD-RDRRMC III on 25 December 2016
- 

#### OCD CALARZON/ RDRRMC CALABARZON

- Alerted the RDRRMC 4A RETT and RDANA Team to be on standby alert for possible deployment
- RETT Members from PNP Communication and Electronics Division (COMMEL) on monitoring and hourly updating of situation in the Area of Responsibility especially in the island municipalities
- 202 IB provided radio communications at the RDRRMOC CALABARZON.

- Tested the Thuraya satellite phone (Operational) and checked available balance
- Established satellite communications through OCD Provincial Coordinators on site

- Alerted DSWD RETT for possible deployment and provided Mobile Communications Vehicle
- Provided High Speed Internet Service Augmentation to Response Cluster Operations Center

### AFP

- Installed High Frequency Base Radios at the NDRRMC Response Cluster Operations Center
- OJ6 issued directive to unified commands and major services re communication support to HADR Units ICOW Typhoon NINA

### PNP

- Issued directive and alerted the PNP-CES and Regional Communication Electronics Office (RCEO) personnel to Regions III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VIII, NCR and NHQ CES

### DICT

- Twenty (20) Thuraya satellite phones were made available for deployment
- Confirmed the receipt of emergency broadcast in the affected provinces through their Regional Offices
- Activated the Bicol Radio Amateur Group.

### REACT

- Installed HF, VHF and UHF base radios with operator at the Response Cluster Emergency Operation Center in Camp General Emilio Aguinaldo, Quezon City

### SMART

Two (2) Thuraya satellite phones were made available for deployment

## HEALTH CLUSTER

### DOH

1. The Department of Health has raised a code alert and issued a memorandum to all regional offices to actively monitor TY Nina.
2. DOH Regional Offices to be affected by TY Nina to activate their respective Operation Centers, and initiate/review the preposition of human resource and stockpiling of medicines and medical supplies to the provinces under their jurisdiction.
3. Ensure continuous coordination with the Provincial DOH Offices (PDOHO), Provincial Health Offices (PHOs), Office of Civil Defense, Regional and Local Disaster Risk Reduction Management Councils.



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4. A total of Php 32,509,530.63 worth of logistics prepositioned in regions I, II, III, IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, VIII, CAR and NCR. At the DOH Central Office a total of Php 41,921,211,46.

### PRC

1. The Philippine Red Cross (PRC) has placed its staff, volunteers and logistics in a state of high alert in the wake of the anticipated impact of Typhoon Nina (international name Nock ten).
2. The Operations Center is closely monitoring the path of the typhoon and is coordinating with concerned Chapters for possible rescue and relief operations.

### AFP Health Service

1. Standby medical teams ready to be mobilized at any given time:
  - a. SOLCOM - 1 medical team from base hospital
  - b. AFP Medical Center - 2 medical teams
  - c. 3 Medical teams ( one team per service - PA, NAVY, PAF)
  - d. 2nd Infantry Division in Tanay, Rizal - 1 medical team

### International Partners

1. The WHO and UNFPA expressed support in the provision of health logistics such as hygiene kits.

### Logistical Support

- A total of **₱32,509.530.63** amount of logistics were propositioned by Regions I, II, III, IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, VIII, CAR and NCR to its provinces. Moreover, a total of **₱41,921,211.46** amount of logistics is present at the DOH Central Office.

- Coordination meetings are held at the National Response Cluster Operations Center (NDRC OpCen), 2nd Floor, NDRRMC Building, Camp General Emilio Aguinaldo, Quezon City
- Cluster Leads are required to detail a senior officer in the NDRRMC OpCen to render a 24/7 basis duty.
