I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

"NINA" HAS MAINTAINED ITS STRENGTH WHILE TRAVERSING THE WEST PHILIPPINE SEA.

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 300 km diameter of the typhoon.
- All Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal are now lifted.
- Possible exit of Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) this evening (Dec 27).
- Sea travel is risky over the seaboards of Northern Luzon and the western seaboard of Central Luzon.

Location of Eye/Center	At 04:00 AM today, the eye of Typhoon "NINA" was located based on all available data at 360 km West of Iba, Zambales (14.7 °N, 116.7 °E) .
Strength	Maximum sustained winds of up to 120 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 150 kph .
Forecast Movement	Forecast to move West at 17 kph
Forecast Positions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 24 Hour(Tomorrow morning): 340 km North of Pagasa Island, Palawan (OUTSIDE PAR) • 48 Hour(Thursday morning):300 km West of Pagasa Island, Palawan (OUTSIDE PAR)

NO TROPICAL CYCLONE WARNING SIGNAL

The public and the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council concerned are advised to take appropriate actions and watch for the next weather bulletin to be issued at **11:00 AM** today.

ACTIONS TAKEN

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated **Severe Weather Bulletin No. 25 for Typhoon "NINA"** to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Offices to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and mountainous areas if situations warrants.
