



## NDRRMC UPDATE

### Severe Weather Bulletin No. 27 (Final) re Typhoon "NINA" (NOCK-TEN)

#### I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

"NINA" is about to exit the western boundary of the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the **300 km** diameter of the Storm
- Sea travel is risky over the seaboard of Northern Luzon and western sea board of Central Luzon due to the surge of the northeast monsoon.

<b>Location of Eye/Center</b>	At <b>10:00 PM today</b> , the center of Severe Tropical Storm "NINA" was estimated based on all available data at 355 km North Northeast of Pagasa Island, Palawan ( <b>14.0 °N, 115.2 °E</b> )
<b>Strength</b>	Maximum sustained winds of up to <b>75 kph</b> near the center and gustiness of up to <b>90 kph</b>
<b>Forecast Movement</b>	Forecast to move <b>Southwest</b> at 20 kph
<b>Forecast Positions</b>	<b>24 Hour (Tomorrow evening): 230 km West of Pagasa Island, Palawan (OUTSIDE PAR) (11.0 °N, 112.0°E)</b>

#### **NO TROPICAL CYCLONE WARNING SIGNAL**

With this development and unless re-entry occurs, this is the final warning for this weather disturbance.

#### II. ACTIONS TAKEN

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated **Severe Weather Bulletin No. 27 (Final) for Typhoon "NINA"** to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Offices to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and mountainous areas if situations warrants.
