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# **DISASTER RESPONSE PILLAR**

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### **HIGHLIGHTS OF DISASTER RESPONSE ACTIONS**

1. Activation of the Disaster Response Clusters on 251500H Dec 2016 at NDRRMC, Camp Aguinaldo, QC
2. Convened the cluster members on their respective emergency response preparedness and actions
3. Continuous Monitoring of the effects of TY Nina in coordination with RDRRMC member agencies of Regions 8, 5, CaLaBaRZon, MiMaRoPa and NCR on the developments of their disaster response actions



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### FOOD AND NON-FOOD ITEMS CLUSTER

#### DSWD

1. Augmented 64,000 pouches of Ready to Eat Chicken Arrozcaldo to Field Office V intended for strandeers at ports and terminals.
2. Augmented (3) 4,000 pouches of Ready to Eat Meals to Regions 3, 4A and 4B.
3. 65,000 Family Food Packs for additional augmentation to Field Office V
4. Transported thru C130 the 2,585 Family Food Packs from Field Office VII to Virac, Catanduanes.
5. Schedule airlifting of two (2) 1,250 Family Food Packs thru C130 on 28 December at 4:30AM and 5:30AM respectively in Virac Catanduanes.
6. To date, a total of **₱31,085,712.00** worth of relief assistance has been provided to the affected families. Of the said amount, the Department provided **₱31,018,264.00** while the LGUs provided a total of **₱67,488.00**

### CAMP COORDINATION AND CAMP MANAGEMENT AND IDP PROTECTION

To date, there are **132,908 families** or **602,770 persons** affected/displaced in **785 barangays** from **Regions CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V and VIII**; of which, **42,531 families** or **179,269 persons** are currently staying in **507 evacuation centres** while **4 families** or **20 persons** chose to stay with relatives or friends.

### HEALTH CLUSTER

#### DOH

- A total of Php 31, 892,515.63 worth of drugs, medicines and medical supplies are prepositioned in DOH Regional Office I, II, III, IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, VIII, CAR



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and NCR while Php 41, 921,211.46 worth of logistics is available at the DOH Central Office ready for augmentation

- Deployed 5 nurses to Eastern Bicol Medical Center for augmentation support/manpower.
- Provided a total of Php296,402.00 worth of drugs, medicines, medical supplies and hygiene kits to Virac, Catanduanes
- Usec. Herminigildo V. Valle, Asec. Ma. Francia Laxamana, Dir. Gloria J. Balboa and Dr. Vito Roque from the DOH Central Office joined the inter-agency aerial visit in the affected provinces of Region V.
- Conducted initial damaged assessment to health facilities in region V

### **PNP / PRC / AFP Health Services**

- Respective medical response teams from Region III, IV-A, VII and VIII are on standby and ready for deployment and mobilization

### **International Partners**

The World Health Organization and United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) expressed support in the provision of health logistics (hygiene kits)

### **LOGISTICS CLUSTER**

#### **OCD**

- Four (4) C130 planes to transport food and non-food items from Mactan, Cebu to Virac, Catanduanes Airport. A total of 1,485 FFPs were transported thru C130 on 26 December 2016 and 2 flights from Cebu to Virac will transport 3,000 FFPs @ 1,500 each plane to Catanduanes on December 27, 2016.

#### **DPWH**

- Monitored the situation of the major roads & bridges and conducted clearing operations to areas affected by typhoon Nina in region IV-A, V and VIII.
- Sixteen (16) road sections are closed to traffic; two (2) in Region II, three (3) in Region IV-B, Ten (10) in Region V and one (1) in Region VIII due to fallen trees and utility posts, on-going slope protection project (under contract), possible re-occurrence of landslides and high water elevation.



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- Six (6) road sections are affected by previous typhoons and continuous monsoon rains are still closed to traffic; four (4) in CAR due to rock collapse, washed out embankment at abutments and slides and two (2) in Region IV-A due to landslide and rockfall, collapsed slope protection and vertical settlement of road and collapsed bridge.

### **EDUCATION CLUSTER**

#### **DepEd**

- A total of 233 classrooms from 77 schools were used as evacuation centers for 1,692 families or 6,725 individuals.
- Conducted off-site 24/7 monitoring of situation in affected areas;
- Coordinated with the Regional and Division DRRM Coordinators of exposed and affected areas to update and send reports on class suspensions and schools used as evacuation centers;
- Standby-funds available for setting up of Temporary Learning Spaces (TLS) and support for school clean-up;
- Learning kits, teaching kits, and book library kits available and on standby c/o UNICEF;
- Disseminated weather advisories and updates to the key officials and DRRM Coordinators of regions and divisions in the exposed areas via INFO board text blast; e-mail and social media

### **SEARCH RESCUE AND RETRIEVAL CLUSTER**

#### **Armed Forces of the Philippines**

- Conducted Rescue operation in Albay, Camarines Sur, Camarines Norte and Batangas:

#### **Coast Guard District Southern Tagalog (CGDSTL) DRG Team**

1. Closely coordinating with PDRRMO and CDRRMOs/MDRRMOs

#### **Law and Order Cluster**

##### **PNP SAF**

Five (5) Teams from PNP SAF are on standby for security escort in case of relief operations to affected areas to be spearheaded by DSWD. December 26, 2016 at 11:31 AM.



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### **NCRPO**

50 NCRPO personnel provided manpower support in hauling relief goods at the National Resource Operations Center, DSWD, Airport Road, Pasay City.

**Monitored** power failure: Bat-19; Qzn-11; Cav-2.; assessment on passable areas roads and bridges, weather conditions, stranded passengers, flooded areas in the 12 barangays of Oriental Mindoro evacuation centers opened in Bicol region and casualties

### **MANAGEMENT OF THE MISSING AND THE DEAD (MDM)**

#### **DILG**

- One (1) confirmed casualty from FO IV-A (Quezon) and ten (10) are still for verification they are 2 from FOIV-A, 3 from IV-B, 4 from FO V and 1 from FO VIII while four (4) are missing of which 2 are from FO IV-B and 2 are from FO VIII.

#### **OCD**

- Activated the Emergency Telecommunications Cluster (ETC) effective 251500H December 2016
- Regional Rapid Emergency Telecommunication Teams (RETT) in Regions III, MIMAROPA, CALABARZON, V, VI, and VIII were activated and on standby alert
- Satellite Phone System at the OCDROs are on standby alert
- Directed the OCDROs to utilize the Mobile Application “Batingaw” for information dissemination and status updates
- Disseminated warning information about Typhoon NINA (NOCK-TEN) to general public through telecommunication companies using emergency broadcast system

#### **ERIC**

- Deployed personnel at the Response Cluster Operations Center in Camp General Emilio Aguinaldo, Quezon City
- Deployed systems to aid integration of reports, actions and resolution in NDRRMC Response Cluster:  
*responseops.ph – collaboration platform*  
*eric-ims – incident management system*  
*drr-sitrep – situation report consolidation*



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### AFP

- Installed High Frequency Base Radios at the NDRRMC Response Cluster Operations Center
- OJ6 issued directive to unified commands and major services re communication support to HADR Units ICOW Typhoon NINA

### PNP

- Issued directive and alerted the PNPCEs and Regional Communication Electronics Office (RCEO) personnel to Regions III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VIII, NCR and NHQ CES

### DICT

- Activated the Bicol Radio Amateur Group.
- Monitored areas with weak signal and/or reception from GLOBE and SMART and PLDT in Mindoro, Batangas.
- NTC activated Bayanihan Task Force to monitor the telecommunication services

### REACT

- Installed HF, VHF and UHF base radios with operator at the Response Cluster Emergency Operation Center in Camp General Emilio Aguinaldo, Quezon City

### SMART

1. Two (2) Thuraya satellite phones were made available for deployment
- Network Status and Availability
    2. 2G & 3G (call & text services) is 44% - 100% operational, in most areas affected by Typhoon Nina except for Catanduanes which has remains at 0%, as of 27 Dec 2016, 04:00 PM

### GLOBE

- Network Status and Availability
  3. 2G & 3G (call & text services) is at 100% operational, in most areas affected by Typhoon Nina as of 27 Dec 2016, 04:00 PM

### PDRF

- SMART has confirmed Libreng Tawag for deployment to Boac, Marinduque and Calapan, Oriental Mindoro.
- Libreng Tawag and Libreng Charging was provided in Sorsogon, Camarines Sur and Naga City



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### MovePH/Agos-eBayanihan

- Mobilized Movers and Agos volunteers to collect typhoon-related information and monitor social media
- Captured over 100 #NinaPH reports on the Agos Alert Map
- Updated Agos Alert Map ([agos.rappler.com/map](http://agos.rappler.com/map)) information overlays on #NinaPH, hazards and power transmission facilities status for ready reference
- Facilitated two (2) on-line rescue requests for Response Cluster action
- Published at least ten (10) typhoon-related articles on [rappler.com](http://rappler.com)
- Posted and amplified #NinaPH updates on Rappler, MovePH and Agos social media accounts

- Activities of the Response Clusters are being coordinated by the Office of Civil Defense (OCD) Operations Division and the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD).
- Coordination meetings are held at the NDRRMC conference room
- Cluster Leads are required to detail a senior officer in the NDRMMC OpCen to render a 24/7 basis duty.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Response Cluster Meeting was held on December 27, 2016; at 9:00 in the morning.
- While the 4<sup>th</sup> Response Cluster meeting is scheduled at on December 28, 2016 at 9:00AM
- RDANA Teams organized in Regions IV-B and V
