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HIGHLIGHTS OF DISASTER RESPONSE ACTIONS

1. Activation of the Disaster Response Clusters on 28 1800H Dec 2016 to 29 0600H at NDRRMC, Camp Aguinaldo, QC
2. Convened the cluster members on their respective emergency response preparedness and actions
3. Continuous Monitoring of the effects of TY Nina in coordination with RDRRMC member agencies of Regions 5, CaLaBaRZon and MiMaRoPa on the developments of their disaster response actions

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FOOD AND NON-FOOD ITEMS CLUSTER

DSWD

1. Augmented 64,000 pouches of Ready to Eat Chicken Arrozcaldo to Field Office V intended for strandeers at ports and terminals.
2. Augmented (3) 4,000 pouches of Ready to Eat Meals to Regions 3, 4A and 4B.
3. 65,000 Family Food Packs for additional augmentation to Field Office V
4. Transported thru C130 the 2,585 Family Food Packs from Field Office VII to Virac, Catanduanes.
5. Airlifted 1,100 Family Food Packs thru C130 on 28 December at 5:30AM in Virac, Catanduanes.
6. To date, a total of **₱ 48,947,471.84** worth of relief assistance has been provided to affected families and stranded passengers in **Regions CALABARZON, MIMAROPA and V**. Of the said amount, the Department provided **₱ 47,715,926.84** while the LGUs provided a total of **₱1,231,545**.

CAMP COORDINATION AND CAMP MANAGEMENT AND IDP PROTECTION

To date, there is a total of **131,011 families** or **590,069 persons** displaced in **Regions CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V and VIII**; of which, **37,271 families** or **152,112 persons** are currently staying in **831 evacuation centers**, while **501 families** or **2,367 persons** chose to stay with relatives or friends:

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OCD

- Four (4) C130 planes to transport food and non-food items from Mactan, Cebu to Virac, Catanduanes Airport. A total of 1,485 FFPs were transported thru C130 on 26 December 2016 and 2 flights from Cebu to Virac will transport 3,000 FFPs @ 1,500 each plane to Catanduanes on December 27, 2016.

DPWH

Two (2) road sections are closed to traffic; one (1) in Region II due to high water elevation and one (1) in Region VIII due to on-going slope protection project (under contract) and possible re-occurrence of landslides.

EDUCATION CLUSTER

DepEd

- A total of 182 classrooms from 56 schools were used as evacuation centers for 1,076 families or 4,361 individuals
- DepEd personnel from the Division of Marinduque joined the conduct of the RDANA (still ongoing) in the province of Marinduque;
- Conducted field visit (by selected Execom members & staff) to Catanduanes and Camarines Sur
- Disseminated advisory on the submission of Rapid Assessment of Damage Reports (consolidation still ongoing);
- Attended the Response Operations Meeting;
- Conducted on-site (Operations Center) and off-site 24/7 monitoring of situation of affected areas;
- Coordinated with the Regional and Division DRRM Coordinators of exposed and affected areas to update and send reports on schools used as evacuation centers
- Standby-funds available for setting up of Temporary Learning Spaces (TLS) and support for school clean-up;
- Learning kits, teaching kits, and book library kits available and on standby c/o UNICEF;



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- Disseminated weather advisories and updates to the key officials and DRRM Cpprdomatprs pf regions and divisions in the exposed areas via INFO board text blast; e-mail and social media;
- Attended the 1st, 2nd and 3rd Pre-disaster Risk Assessment (PDRA) meeting in NDRRMC, Camp Aguinaldo, Quezon City; and ,
- Disseminated and reiterated DepEd Memorandum (DM) no. 159,s. 2015 regarding the Safety and Preparedness Measures for the Holiday Season.

SEARCH RESCUE AND RETRIEVAL CLUSTER

Armed Forces of the Philippines

- Conducted Rescue operation in Albay, Camarines Sur, Camarines Norte and Batangas:



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Coast Guard District Southern Tagalog (CGDSTL) DRG Team

- As of 281800H December 2016, a total of Seventy Six Thousand Two Hundred Ninety Six (76,296) outbound passengers and Seventy Eight Thousand Two Hundred Eighty One (78,281) inbound passengers were monitored by PCG Districts. Compared to the 281200H December 2016 consolidated report, the number of outbound passengers has decreased by Eight Thousand Eight Hundred Eighty (8,880) or Ten Percent (10%) and the inbound passengers has also decreased by Two Thousand Four Hundred Seventeen (2,417) or Three Percent (3%).
- Relatively, PCG personnel were able to inspect a total of Two Hundred Eighty Nine (289) vessels and One Thousand One Hundred Five (1,105) motorbancas in different ports nationwide. Compared to the 280600H December 2016 consolidated report, the number of vessels inspected has decreased by Four Hundred Sixty Two (462) or Sixty Two Percent (62%) and the motorbancas had also increased Three Hundred Ninety Two (392) or Fifty Five Percent (55%).

Five (5) Teams from PNP SAF are on standby for security escort in case of relief operations to affected areas to be spearheaded by DSWD. December 26, 2016 at 11:31 AM.

NCRPO

MANAGEMENT OF THE MISSING AND THE DEAD (MDM)

DILG

- One (1) confirmed casualty from FO IV-A (Quezon) and ten (10) are still for verification they are 2 from FO IV-A, 3 from IV-B, 4 from FO V and 1 from FO VIII while four (4) are missing of which 2 are from FO IV-B and 2 are from FO VIII.

OCD

- Activated the Emergency Telecommunications Cluster (ETC) effective 251500H December 2016
- Regional Rapid Emergency Telecommunication Teams (RETT) in Regions III, MIMAROPA, CALABARZON, V, VI, and VIII were activated and on standby alert
- Satellite Phone System at the OCDROs are on standby alert
- Directed the OCDROs to utilize the Mobile Application “Batingaw” for information dissemination and status updates
- Disseminated warning information about Typhoon NINA (NOCK-TEN) to general public through telecommunication companies using emergency broadcast system
