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HIGHLIGHTS OF DISASTER RESPONSE ACTIONS

1. Activation of the Disaster Response Clusters on 201700H January 2017 at NDRRMC, Camp Aguinaldo, QC
2. Convened the cluster members for a briefing on their respective emergency response preparedness and actions
3. Continuous Monitoring of the effects of a Tail-End of a Cold Front in coordination with RDRRMC member agencies of Regions NIR, X, XI, CARAGA, XII and ARMM, on developments and possible need for disaster response action



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FOOD AND NON-FOOD ITEMS CLUSTER

Status of Prepositioned Resources: Stockpile and Standby Funds

The Central Office (CO), Field Offices (FOs), and National Resource Operations Center (NROC) have a total standby funds and stockpiles amounting to **₱1,888,108,488.21** with breakdown as follows:

a. Standby Funds

There is a total of **₱1,178,317,853.55** standby funds at the CO and FOs. Of the said amount, **₱1,128,988,928.02** is the available Quick Response Fund at the CO.

b. Stockpiles

There is also a total of **602,231** Family Food Packs (FFPs) amounting to **₱215,440,271.60** and available Food and Non-Food Items (FNFI) amounting to **₱494,350,363.06**.

CAMP COORDINATION AND CAMP MANAGEMENT

Number of Affected Families / Persons

To date, there are **58,334 families** or **276,860 persons** affected in **482 barangays** in Regions NIR, VII, VIII, IX, X, XII, and CARAGA.

Status of Displaced Families/ Persons

To date, there is a total of **30,794 families** or **157,465 persons** displaced in **Regions NIR, VII, VIII, IX, X and CARAGA**; of which, **17,237 families** or **84,292 persons** are



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staying in **200 evacuation centers**; while **2,216 families** or **10,494 persons** are staying outside the ECs with their relatives or friends.

Damaged Houses

To date, there is a total of **161 damaged houses** in **Regions VII, VIII, X, and CARAGA**; of which, **109 are partially damaged** and **52 are totally damaged**.

Assistance Provided

DSWD

To date, a total of **₱7,282,478.90** worth of assistance has been provided to affected families in **Regions NIR, VII, VIII, X, and CARAGA**. Of the said amount, the **Department has provided ₱6,415,628.36**, while the **LGUs provided ₱866,850.54**.

LOGISTICS CLUSTER

DPWH

Three (3) road sections are not passable to all types of vehicles: one (1) in Region VII due to landslide and rock fall and two (2) in Region XIII due to flooding.

DPWH District Engineering Offices installed warning signs and deployed personnel and equipment to conduct clearing operations.

All national road networks in Regions VIII, X, XI and NIR are passable to all types of vehicles.

1. Butuan City-Talacogon-Loreto-Veruela-Sta Josefa Road
 - a. Talacogon, Zillovia Section, K1328+500-K1329+970 Flooded roadway (d=1.7m) Flood/guide marker provided and deployed personnel on site to monitor and assist commuters
2. NRJ Bayugan-Esperanza Road
 - a. Esperanza, Hawilian Section, Esperanza Bridge Approach "B" K1282+200 Flooded (d=1.0m) Flood/guide marker provided and deployed personnel on site to monitor and assist commuters
 - b. Esperanza, Hawilian Section, Esperanza Bridge Approach "A" K1281+000 Flooded (d=0.3m) Flood/guide marker provided and deployed personnel on site to monitor and assist commuters

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HEALTH CLUSTER

DOH CONFIRMED CASUALTIES Twelve (12) deaths and eight (8) injured victims were validated in Zamboanga Del Norte, Cagayan de Oro City, Misamis Oriental, Eastern Samar and Leyte by DOH Regional Offices VIII, IX, and X. All reported deaths died due to asphyxia secondary to drowning, all were flash flood victims. All injured victims suffered minor injuries and treated on site.

ACTIONS TAKEN

A. PREPAREDNESS

DOH Regional Offices VII, VIII, IX, X and NIR:

On Code Alert

Positioned drugs/medicines and medical supplies to respective provinces

B. RESPONSE

DOH HEMB:

Continuously coordinating with the DOH Regional Offices VII, VIII, IX, X, NIR and the NDRRMC for the updates and possible needs in the affected areas.

DOH Regional Offices VII, VIII, IX, X and NIR:

- Activated Operations Center for event monitoring and coordination of needs
Continuously coordinating with respective PDOHOs and PDRRMOs/CDRRMOs for possible needs and uniformity of response actions
- Conducted Rapid Health Assessment (RHA) together with local health authorities in affected areas; the teams deployed also distributed logistics to the affected areas
- Distributed Doxycycline (Leptospirosis Prophylaxis) to identified evacuation centers
- Continuously coordinating with respective Provincial DOH Offices and RDRRMCs for event updates and possible response need

Provincial DOH Offices of Eastern Samar, Northern Samar, Western Samar, Biliran, Southern Leyte:

- Conducted RHA together with DOH Regional personnel



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- Continuously coordinating with respective PDRRMOs/CDRRMOs for possible needs in affected areas

DOH RO X

- Mobilized a team to Ginoog City and Iligan City in coordination with the Office of Civil Defense to conduct Rapid Disaster Needs Analysis (RDNA)

EDUCATION CLUSTER

There are 49 schools used as Evacuation Centers in 4 regions - 13, 10, 8 and 6 - in which 2,953 families or 12,765 individuals are using 118 classrooms.

Two regions - 10 and 8 - also reported of infrastructure and non-infrastructure damages:

1. Region 10 - 6 schools reported 1 totally damaged classroom and 5 partially damaged classrooms while 16 schools reported 677 damage school furniture, 3,296 damaged learning resources, and 33 damaged computer sets.

2. Region 8 - 2 schools reported 12 totally damaged classrooms and 5 partially damaged classrooms while 2 schools reported 2,805 learning resources and 10 damaged computer sets.

In total, there are 11 schools with 12 totally damaged classrooms and 5 partially damaged classrooms while 18 schools in 5 divisions reported 677 damaged school furniture, 6,101 damaged learning resources, and 43 damaged computer sets.

Response:

1. Attended the PDRA meeting in NDRRMC, Camp Aguinaldo, Quezon;
2. Disseminated weather advisories and updates to the key officials and DRRM Coordinators of regions and divisions in the exposed areas via INFO board text blast and email;
3. Coordinated with Regional and Division DRRM Coordinators of exposed and affected areas to update and send reports on class suspensions, resumptions and schools used as evacuation centers;
4. Disseminated advisory on the submission of Rapid Assessment of Damage Reports;



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5. On-going consolidation of the RADaR submission of field personnel and vetting of (partially) consolidated results for provision of clean-up funds (P15,000) and TLS to affected schools;
 6. Standby-funds available for setting up of Temporary Learning Spaces (TLS) and support for school clean-up; and,
 7. Learning kits, teaching kits, and book library kits available and on standby c/o UNICEF.

- Activities of the Response Clusters are being coordinated by the Office of Civil Defense (OCD) Operations Division and the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD).
