# EMERGENCY TELECOMMUNICATIONS CLUSTER



## OFFICE OF CIVIL DEFENSE (OCD)

- **Deployed personnel** at the Response Cluster Operations Center in Camp General Emilio Aguinaldo, Quezon City

# EMERGENCY TELECOMMUNICATIONS CLUSTER



## REACT

- Installed **HF, VHF and UHF base radios with operator** at the Emergency Operation Centers in Response Cluster Operation Center
- The **REACT Communication Van** in the Camp Gen. Emilio Aguinaldo, Quezon City is on **standby alert**.
- Deployed their **Rapid Emergency Telecommunication Teams (RETT)** in **CARAGA Region**.



## SMART

- Provided **Libreng Charging and Libreng Tawag Stations** at Philcom Surigao, Narciso Street, Surigao City, Surigao del Norte.
- **No service-affecting damage** to Smart/Sun network.
- Smart Store and Sun Shop in Surigao City will be **transferred to temporary locations** to service their subscribers after the commercial buildings where these are located sustained heavy damage.

## **GLOBE**

- **Restoration on the affected sites is ongoing** by the Mindanao Field Operations Team

### **2G (call & text services) as of 11 February 2017, 03:00PM.**

- Dinagat Islands 6 out of 8 cell sites are operational (75%)
- Surigao Del Norte 35 out of 36 cell sites are operational (97%)

### **3G (call, text and internet services) as of 11 February 2017, 03:00PM.**

- Dinagat Islands 6 out of 8 cell sites are operational (75%)
- Surigao Del Norte 35 out of 36 cell sites are operational (97%)

# HEALTH CLUSTER



## DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

- **Continuous intra- and inter-agency coordination** on the provision of identified needs in the affected areas.
- **To deploy composite teams on WASH and surveillance** from Regional Office X composed of nine (9) nurses to provide technical assistance to Surigao City on February 12, 2017. A **water treatment unit** will also be provided.
- **Deployed a 10-man medical/public health team** from Caraga Regional Office to provide initial logistical needs to Caraga Regional Hospital (CRH).
- **Deployed 1 Mental Health and Psychological Support (MHPS) team** that provided level 1 and level 2 interventions to **21 affected individuals**.

# HEALTH CLUSTER



## DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH (DOH)

- **Augmented a total of Php 192,260.00 worth of logistical support** including assorted drugs and medicines, portable generator, 30 liters gasoline, 5 family tents, 20 cot beds, 230 water containers.
- **Conducted Rapid Health Assessment (RHA)** in Surigao City to assess the needs and structural damage on the health facilities brought about by the said incident.
- **Identified Php 5,000,000.00 worth of structural damage** was assessed in CRH.
- **Coordinated with ambulance services** from the local government unit for the **transfer of patients from CRH to Davao or Cagayan de Oro** for further treatment and management.



# HEALTH CLUSTER



## **ARMED FORCES OF THE PHILIPPINES (AFP)**

- Coordinated with DOH for the **inclusion of 3 standby medical teams** from the Philippine Airforce and Philippine Navy.
- **One (1) ambulance is available** with the team from Philippine Navy.



## **PHILIPPINE RED CROSS**

- Provided **first aid management** to the injured individuals.
- Assisted the regional hospital in patient transfers.
- Deployed a **water tanker, water treatment unit and water bladders** to Surigao City together with personnel from Tacloban City and expected to arrive on February 12, 2017.
- Assets in Iligan City and Davao City are on standby.
- **Deployed a total of 4 additional ambulance teams** expected to arrive on the evening of February 11 and 12, 2017.

# LOGISTICS CLUSTER



## OFFICE OF CIVIL DEFENSE

- The Office of Civil Defense (OCD) coordinated with OJ3 AFP for the **accommodation of DSWD relief goods at PAF C130**. Request was approved by OJ3 at 2045H 11 Feb 2016. Flight at 0500H 12 Feb 2017.



## DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS AND HIGHWAYS

- **Five (5) road sections and five (5) national bridges were reported to have damages in Region XIII. All affected national roads and bridges are still passable.**
- DPWH District Engineering Offices **installed warning signs** and deployed personnel and equipment to **conduct clearing operations and placement of filling materials** on bridge approaches.
- DPWH Regional Office XIII also **deployed three (3) teams to conduct an initial assessment** on damaged buildings, roads, and bridges.

<b>7. KINABUTAN I BRIDGE</b>		
<b>a. K1121+642, Daang Maharlika Road (Lipata-Surigao Section)</b>	Cracks/buckling/pop-up of Steel Plate and damaged concrete railing. <b><u>Passable to light vehicles only</u></b>	Steel Plate and Warning Signs at bridge approaches provided. Heavy Vehicles are diverted to Surigao Wharf Road connecting Surigao City-San Juan Coastal going in and from Lipata Port and Surigao-Agusan Road

8. KINABUTAN II BRIDGE		
a. K1121+826, Daang Maharlika Road (Lipata-Surigao Section)	Depressed approach slab/damaged concrete railings. <b><u>Passable to light vehicles only</u></b>	Steel Plate and Warning Signs at bridge approaches provided. Heavy Vehicles are diverted to Surigao Wharf Road connecting Surigao City-San Juan Coastal going in and from Lipata Port and Surigao-Agusan Road
9. FRIENDSHIP BRIDGE		
a. K1118+191, Surigao-San Juan Coastal Road	Settlement of approach A due to damaged slope protection. Noted cracks on girder. <b><u>Passable to all types of vehicles</u></b>	Warning signs and filling materials provided at bridge approach.
10. BANAHAW BRIDGE		
a. K1115+425, Surigao-San Juan Coastal Road	Damaged slope protection. <b><u>Passable to all types of vehicles</u></b>	Warning signs provided at bridge approach.

# **EDUCATION CLUSTER**



## **DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION**

- Coordinated with Regional and Division DRRM Coordinators of DepEd CARAGA to **send reports on schools used as evacuation centers;**
- Regional and Division DRRM Coordinators of DepEd CARAGA are **activated to monitor the damages report of the schools;**
- **Disseminated advisory on the submission of Rapid Assessment of Damages Report (RADAR)** via INFOBoard text blast;
- **Standby-funds available for setting up of Temporary Learning Spaces (TLS)** and support for school clean-up and minor repairs; and,
- **Learning kits, teaching kits, and book library kits available** and on standby c/o UNICEF.



# **SEARCH RESCUE AND RETRIEVAL CLUSTER**

## **ARMED FORCES OF THE PHILIPPINES (AFP)**

- Disaster Emergency and Rescue squad of Charlie Company, 30th Infantry Battalion, 4ID, PA aboard one (1) KM450 and proceeded to Barangay Anao-aon Gymnasium, San Francisco, Surigao del Norte to **evacuate three (3) critically wounded civilians.**
- On 102300 February 2017, **Disaster Emergency and Rescue Platoon of 30th Infantry Battalions, 4ID, PA with two (2) M35 trucks and one (1) KM450 vehicle** proceeded towards PDRRMO, Surigao City for possible Disaster Rescue Operations.

- 30th IB personnel **provided security and assistance all throughout the relief operations** in Surigao City.
- On 111100 February 2017, COL FRANCO NEMESIO M GACAL INF (GSC) PA, Commander, 402Bde, 4ID, PA and LTC RICO C AMARO INF (GSC) PA, Commanding Officer, 30th IB **attended CDRRMC emergency meeting** at City Hall Conference room presided by Hon Ernesto T. Matugas, City Mayor of Surigao City.



# General Coordination

- **Each Response Cluster Lead** shall consolidate all reports of their respective members and submit to the Response Cluster Secretariat. **(Individual agency report will not be accepted)**
- Activities of the Response Pillar are being coordinated by the Office of Civil Defense (OCD) Operations Division and the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)
- Coordination meetings are held at the National Response Cluster Operations Center (NDRC OpCen), 2nd Floor, NDRRMC Building, Camp General Emilio Aguinaldo, Quezon City.
- Cluster Leads are required to detail a senior officer in the NDRRMC OpCen to render a 24/7 basis duty.
