15 February 2017 as 4:00 PM

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HIGHLIGHTS OF DISASTER RESPONSE ACTIONS

- At 10:03 PM on 10 February 2017, Friday, a strong earthquake of magnitude 6.7 shook the island of Mindanao.
- The epicenter is located 16 km offshore northwest of Surigao City, Surigao Strait at a depth of 10 km.
- The earthquake was generated by the movement of Surigao segment of the Philippine Fault.
- Aftershocks have been recorded by the PHIVOLCS seismic monitoring network.

DSWD

- Two camp management trained personnel were deployed to Surigao City today February 13, 2017 0700H on board C130 together with the deployed tents.

EMERGENCY TELECOMMUNICATIONS CLUSTER

REACT

Deployed 18 personnel to support Surigao Province
Deployed their Rapid Emergency Telecommunication Teams (RETT) in CARAGA Region.

SMART

- Provided Libreng Charging and Libreng Tawag Station at Philcom Surigao, Narciso Street, Surigao City, Surigao del Norte.
- Smart/Sun network did not sustain any service-affecting damage due to the earthquake that hit Surigao City and the Caraga region.
- Smart Store and Sun Shop in Surigao City will be transferred to temporary locations to service our subscribers after the commercial buildings where these are located sustained heavy damage.

HEALTH CLUSTER

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH (DOH)

Actions taken:

- **Structural engineers to conduct** cost-estimate of damaged health facilities in the affected areas.
- DOH Caraga Regional Office deployed a 20-man medical/public health, MHPSS, and WASH teams.
- DOH Regional Office X deployed a 23-man WASH and surveillance teams. These teams provided services as follows:
 - Assisted the MHPSS team
 - Provided medical services and disease surveillance
 - Assisted in patient referrals to other hospitals



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- Evaluated the water source at Sitio Biorbojan for possible source of water.
- Rapid Health Assessment (RHA) was conducted in Surigao City and in the municipalities of Malimono and Sison, Surigao del Norte.
- Provided psychosocial services to 109 patients in Caraga Regional Hospital (CRH).
- Deployed additional MHPSS and WASH teams to Surigao City.
- The medical team from RO X assisted in the emergency operations and disease surveillance at CRH.
- DOH Region XIII coordinated with BFP Regional office for Steel Truck storage for drinking water
- Coordinated with Butuan Chinese Fire Brigade for tapping their logistics available for Drinking water storage
- Raised Code Alert at the Central Office and Caraga Region
- Continuous intra- and inter-agency coordination on the provision of identified needs in the affected areas. **It was agreed that the CDRRMO will manage the schedule of water delivery.**
- Additional augmentation of logistics include 1,000 family kits (Php 350,000), 50 CAMPOLAS kits (Php 607,400), 500 water containers (Php 100,000), and 500 hygiene kits (Php 350,000) with total amount of Php 1,457,160.
- Deployed a 10-man medical/public health team from Caraga Regional Office to provide initial logistical needs to Caraga Regional Hospital (CRH).
- Deployed 1 Mental Health and Psychological Support (MHPSS) team that provided level 1 and level 2 interventions to 21 affected individuals.
- Deployed composite teams on WASH and surveillance from Regional Office X composed of nine (9) nurses to provide technical assistance to Surigao City on February 12, 2017. A water treatment unit will also be provided.
- Augmented a total of Php 192,260.00 worth of logistical support including assorted drugs and medicines, portable generator, 30 liters gasoline, 5 family tents, 20 cot beds, 230 water containers.
- Conducted Rapid Health Assessment (RHA) in Surigao City to assess the needs and structural damage on the health facilities brought about by the said incident.
- Identified Php 7,000,000.00 worth of structural damage was assessed in CRH.
- Coordinated with ambulance services from the local government unit for the transfer of patients from CRH to Davao or Cagayan de Oro for further treatment and management.
- Additional Php 610,000.25 worth of assorted drugs and medicines, water containers, and hygiene kits repositioned in Surigao del Norte.



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GAPS IDENTIFIED:

Php 1,457,160.00 worth of logistics (hygiene kits, family kits, CAMPOLAS and water container awaiting shipment via C-130.

Movement of logistics going to Surigao City and other neighboring municipalities affected by the said event.

ARMED FORCES OF THE PHILIPPINES (AFP)

Actions taken:

- Coordinated with DOH for the inclusion of 3 standby medical teams from the Philippine Airforce and Philippine Navy.
- One (1) ambulance is available with the team from Philippine Navy.
- Additional one (1) standby PAF DRTU Team ICOW Surigao Earthquake

PHILIPPINE RED CROSS

Actions taken:

- Provided first aid management to the injured individuals.
- Assisted the regional hospital in patient transfers.
- Assets in Iligan City and Davao City are on standby.
- Deployed total of 4 additional ambulance teams expected to arrive on the evening of February 11 and 12, 2017.
- **Positioned one (1) water filtration unit in CRH and one (1) in Sison, Surigao del Norte.**
- **Six (6) water bladders are stationed at CRH.**
- **Provided 5 family tents, 2 onion tanks, 4 generator sets, and 2 water tankers.**
- **Metropolitan Manila Development Authority (MMDA)**

Provided five (5) water filtration units to Surigao City.

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LOGISTICS CLUSTER

(No significant changes)

OFFICE OF CIVIL DEFENSE (OCD)

The Office of Civil Defense (OCD) coordinated with OJ3 AFP for the accommodation of DSWD relief goods at PAF C130. Request was approved by OJ3 at 2045H 11 Feb 2016. Flight at 0500H 12 Feb 2017 and 0945H 12 Feb 2017 touch down in Butuan City.

Coordinated the request for aircraft to transport various goods and personnel of DOH and DSWD, including campolas kit, family kit, jerry cans, hygiene kit, family tent, mobile kitchen, laminated sacks, high energy biscuits, family tent, brown rice bar and plastic mats, estimated time of departure in Villamor Airbase is on 13 February 2017, 6:00 AM for DOH and 7:00 AM for DSWD.

Coordinated the request for M35 trucks and personnel to assist for the transport of the Food and Non Food Items of the DSWD, from Butuan airport to Surigao.

Facilitated the possible transport of team composed of personnel from Pilipinas 911, 505th SRG-AFP, and CDRRMO Surigao City to conduct reconnaissance in Nonoc Island, Surigao del Norte.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS AND HIGHWAYS

Five (5) road sections and five (5) national bridges were reported to have damages in Region XIII. All affected national roads and bridges are still passable.

DPWH District Engineering Offices installed warning signs and deployed personnel and equipment to conduct clearing operations and placement of filling materials on bridge approaches.

Technical personnel from DPWH and PICE-ASEP EQRP Team are continually conducting evaluation/assessment on National Government-Owned Buildings, Hospitals and School Buildings and Other Infrastructure Facilities.

Anao-aon Bridge under the **Provincial Road** of Surigao del Norte located in the Municipality of San Francisco had collapsed and closed to traffic. **No alternate routes identified.** DPWH personnel were deployed on site for augmentation. **On-going installation of temporary timber bridge.** New construction of bridge (L=165 l.m) is recommended with an estimated amount of Php 115,000,000.00.

Class Suspension in Surigao City and Surigao del Norte – All Levels

Actions taken:

- **Allocated clean-up funds for schools with infrastructure (totally and/or major damage) and/or non-infrastructure damage in Dinagat Island and Surigao City based on division-vetted reports (PARTIAL);**
- **On-going coordination for the conduct of Training on Psychological First Aid (PFA) and Alternative Delivery Modes (ADM) in CARAGA next week for immediate implementation afterwards;**
- On-going conduct of structural assessment of public and private schools by DepEd Engineers of CARAGA;
- Conduct of Psychosocial First Aid (PFA) and Alternative Delivery Mode (ADM) Training next week to affected areas of DepEd CARAGA;
- Activated #SchoolPatrolPH to engage the general public in the collection of picture of damaged schools through social media such as Twitter and Facebook; • Coordinated with Regional and Division DRRM Coordinators
- Coordinated with Regional and Division DRRM Coordinators of DepEd CARAGA to send reports on schools used as evacuation centers;
- Regional and Division DRRM Coordinators of DepEd CARAGA are activated to monitor the damages report of the schools;
- Disseminated advisory on the submission of Rapid Assessment of Damages Report (RADAR) via INFOBoard text blast;
- Standby-funds available for setting up of Temporary Learning Spaces (TLS) and support for school clean-up and minor repairs; and,
- Learning kits, teaching kits, and book library kits available and on standby c/o UNICEF.

ARMED FORCES OF THE PHILIPPINES (AFP) (No Changes on the report)

Actions taken:

- Disaster Emergency and Rescue squad of Charlie Company, 30th Infantry Battalion, 4ID, PA aboard one (1) KM450 and proceeded to Barangay Anaon-an Gymnasium, San Francisco, Surigao del Norte to evacuate the three (3) critically wounded civilians. SRR Cluster indicates that they need transportation to evacuate to the nearest hospital.
- On 102300 February 2017, Disaster Emergency and Rescue Platoon of 30th Infantry Battalion, 4ID, PA with two (2) M35 trucks and one (1) KM450 vehicle proceeded towards PDRRMO, Surigao City for possible Disaster Rescue Operations.
- 30th IB personnel provided security and assistance all throughout the relief operations in Surigao City.
- On 111100 February 2017, COL FRANCO NEMESIO M GACAL INF (GSC) PA, Commander, 402Bde, 4ID, PA and LTC RICO C AMARO INF (GSC) PA, Commanding Officer, 30th IB attended CDRRMC emergency meeting at City Hall Conference room presided by Hon Ernesto T. Matugas, City Mayor of Surigao City.
