TROPICAL CYCLONE: WARNING

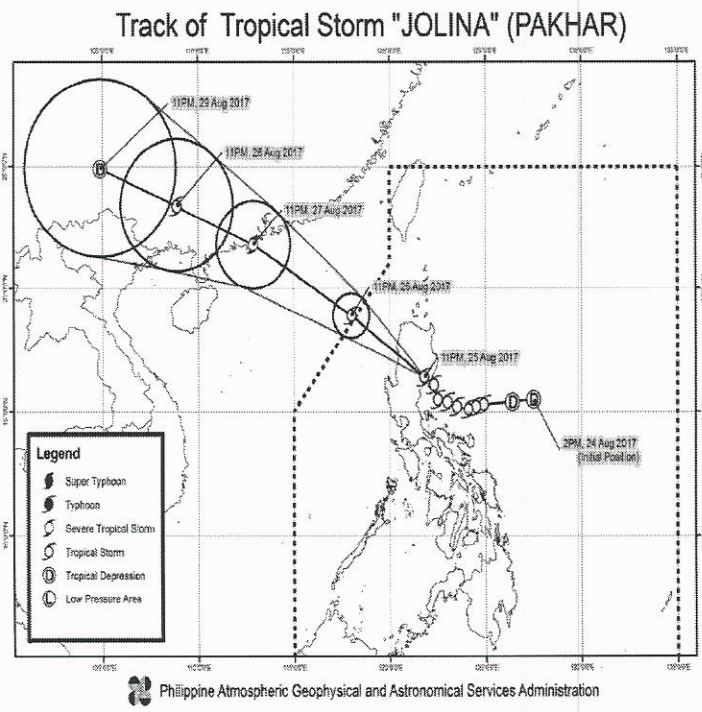
ISSUED AT 2:00 AM, 26 August 2017

(Valid for broadcast until the next bulletin to be issued at 5 AM today)

TROPICAL STORM "JOLINA" HAS MAINTAINED ITS STRENGTH AND IS NOW IN THE VICINITY OF SOUTHERN ISABELA.

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 300 km diameter of the Tropical Storm.
- Moderate to occasionally heavy rains will continue over most parts of Luzon. Residents in these areas, especially those under Tropical Cyclone Warning Signals 2 and 1 are alerted against possible flashfloods and landslides.
- Expected to exit the landmass of Luzon tomorrow morning (26 August).
- Sea travel is risky over the seaboard of Northern Luzon and the eastern seaboard of Central and Southern Luzon.

Location of eye/center	At 1:00 AM today, the center of Tropical Storm "JOLINA" was estimated based on all available data at In the vicinity of San Agustin, Isabela(16.5°N, 121.7°E).
Strength	Maximum sustained winds of up to 80 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 130 kph .
Forecast Movement	Forecast to move Northwest at 19 kph .

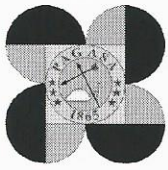

2 (61-120 kph Expected in 24 hours)	Isabela, Aurora, Quirino, Kalinga, Mountain Province, Ifugao, Ilocos Norte, Ilocos Sur, Benguet, Abra, La Union and Nueva Vizcaya.	-	-	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Light to Moderate damage to high risk structures; • Very light to light damage to medium-risk structures; • No damage to very light damage to low risk structures • Unshielded, old dilapidated schoolhouses, makeshift shanties, and other structures of light materials are partially damaged or unroofed. • A number of nipa and cogon houses may be partially or totally unroofed. • Some old galvanized iron (G.I.) roofs may be peeled or blown off. • Some wooden, old electric posts are tilted or downed. • Some damage to poorly constructed signs/billboards • In general, the winds may bring light to moderate damage to the exposed communities. Most banana plants, a few mango trees, ipil-ipil and similar types of trees are downed or broken. • Some coconut trees may be tilted with few others broken. • Rice and corn may be adversely affected. • Considerable damage to shrubbery and trees with some heavy-foliaged trees blown down.
Wave Height: (Open Sea) 4.1-14.0 meters Storm surge possible at coastal areas

Some banana plants are tilted, a few downed and leaves are generally damaged • Twigs of small trees may be broken. • Rice crops, however, may suffer significant damage when it is in its flowering stage.
