

## SEVERE WEATHER BULLETIN #11

### FOR: TROPICAL STORM "JOLINA" (PAKHAR)

### TROPICAL CYCLONE: WARNING

**ISSUED AT 5:00 AM, 26 August 2017**

(Valid for broadcast until the next bulletin to be issued at 8 AM today)

**TROPICAL STORM "JOLINA" HAS SLIGHTLY WEAKENED AND IS NOW IN THE VICINITY OF IFUGAO PROVINCE.**

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 300 km diameter of the Tropical Storm.
- Meanwhile, monsoon rains is expected over the western sections of Central and Southern Luzon, while light to moderate with possible occasionally heavy rains due to thunderstorms will prevail over the rest of Luzon. Residents in these areas, as well as those under Tropical Cyclone Warning Signals 2 and 1 are alerted against possible flashfloods and landslides.
- Expected to exit the landmass of Luzon this morning and the northwestern boundary of PAR tonight.
- Sea travel is risky over the seaboard of Northern and Central Luzon.

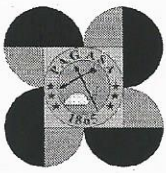

<b>Strength</b>	Maximum sustained winds of up to 75 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 120 kph.	
<b>Forecast Movement</b>	Forecast to move West Northwest at 20 kph.

<b>2</b> (61-120 kph Expected in 24 hours)	Isabela, Quirino, Kalinga, Mountain Province, Ifugao, Ilocos Norte, Ilocos Sur, Benguet, Abra, La Union and Nueva Vizcaya.	-	-	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Light to Moderate damage to high risk structures;</li> <li>• Very light to light damage to medium-risk structures;</li> <li>• No damage to very light damage to low risk structures</li> <li>• Unshielded, old dilapidated schoolhouses, makeshift shanties, and other structures of light materials are partially damaged or unroofed.</li> <li>• A number of nipa and cogon houses may be partially or totally unroofed.</li> <li>• Some old galvanized iron (G.I.) roofs may be peeled or blown off.</li> <li>• Some wooden, old electric posts are tilted or downed.</li> <li>• Some damage to poorly constructed signs/billboards</li> <li>• In general, the winds may bring light to moderate damage to the exposed communities. Most banana plants, a few mango trees, ipil-ipil and similar types of trees are downed or broken.</li> <li>• Some coconut trees may be tilted with few others broken.</li> <li>• Rice and corn may be adversely affected.</li> <li>• Considerable damage to shrubbery and trees with some heavy-foliaged trees blown down.</li> </ul>

<b>1</b> (30-60 kph Expected in 36 hours)	Aurora, Cagayan including Babuyan group of islands, Apayao, Nueva Ecija and Pangasinan.	-	-	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Very light or no damage to low risk structures,</li><li>• Light damage to medium to high risk structures</li><li>• Slight damage to some houses of very light materials or makeshift structures in exposed communities. Some banana plants are tilted, a few downed and leaves are generally damaged</li><li>• Twigs of small trees may be broken.</li><li>• Rice crops, however, may suffer significant damage when it is in its flowering stage.</li></ul>
	Wave Height: (Open Sea) 1.25-4.0 meters			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Tropical Cyclone Warning Signals elsewhere are now lowered or lifted.</li></ul>
