1. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

"URDUJA" HAS MAINTAINED ITS STRENGTH AND IS NOW OVER THE WEST PHILIPPINE SEA.

- Scattered rains will continue over Palawan. Residents of these areas must undertake appropriate measures against flooding and landslides and coordinate with their local disaster risk reduction and management (DRRM) offices.
- **Scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms is expected over the provinces of Isabela, Aurora, and Quezon due to effect of Tail-end of a cold front.**
- Sea travel is not advised over the seaboard of Palawan.
- Expected to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) between tomorrow morning or afternoon.
- Meanwhile, at **3:00 PM** today, the **Low Pressure Area** was estimated based on all available data at **1,450 km East of Mindanao (5.9°N, 139.3°E)**. However, the public and DRRM offices are advised to continue monitoring for updates regarding this weather disturbance.

Location of eye/center	At 4:00 PM today, the center of Tropical Depression "URDUJA" was estimated based on all available data 120km Northwest of Puerto Princesa (10.5°N, 118.0°E) .
Strength	Maximum sustained winds of up to 45 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 60 kph .
Forecast Movement	Forecast to move West Southwest at 18 kph .
