Tropical Storm "URDUJA"

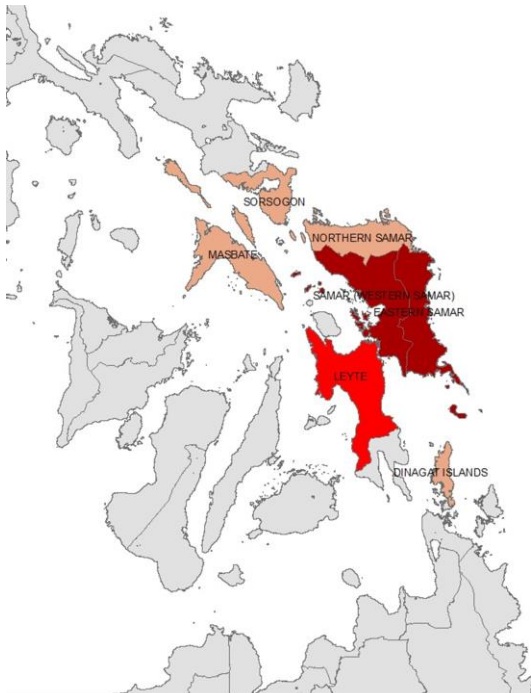
### Situation Overview

- On 12 December 2017, the monitored Low Pressure Area east of Hinatuan, Surigaodel Sur has developed into a Tropical Depression and was named "Urduja". It has intensified into a Tropical Storm as it continued to threaten Samar provinces on 14 December 2017. As of 4:00 AM of December 16, the center of Tropical Storm "URDUJA" was estimated based on all available data including Guiuan Doppler Radar at 180 km East Northeast of Borongan City, Eastern Samar
- To date: **35,188 families** or **158,700 persons** affected in **326 barangays** in Regions **V, VIII and CARAGA**.

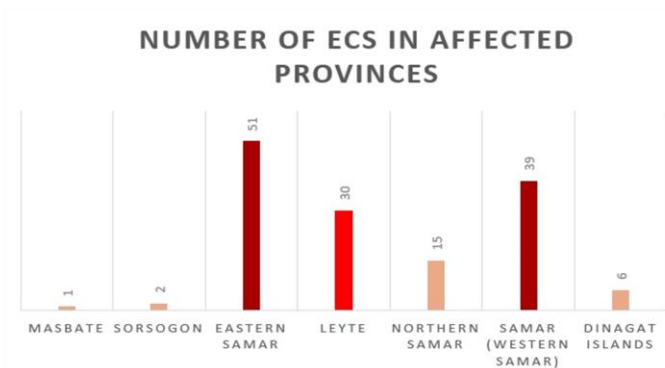
A total of **8,997 families** or **39,775 persons** are currently staying inside **144 evacuation centers** in **Regions V, VIII and CARAGA**.

### Camp Coordination and Camp Management & IDP Protection

A total of **8,831 families** or **38,846 persons** are currently staying inside **141 evacuation centers** in **Regions VIII and CARAGA** while **1 family** or **4 persons** are currently staying outside evacuation center in **Region VIII**.

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### Responses:

- Affected families inside evacuation centers are being attended by their respective LGUs and providing relief assistance.
- The DSWD Regional Disaster Response Assistance Unit's (DREAMU) are closely coordinating with Social Welfare Assistance Development Teams to ensure provision of relief augmentation to the affected areas.
- CCCM and IDP Protection Cluster continuous coordination with the DSWD Regional Offices VIII and CARAGA on protection issues for provision of appropriate interventions in all open evacuation centers.
- The LGU of Matnog, Sorsogon, Bulan and Pilar continuously provides hot meals three times a day through installation of communication kitchen to stranded families.

### Food and Non-Food Items

The DSWD Central Office (CO), Field Offices (FOs), and National Resource Operations Center (NROC) have stockpiles and standby funds amounting to ₱773,939,150.97 with breakdown as follows:

#### Stockpiles

A total of 356,490 Family Food Packs (FFPs) amounting to ₱118,864,642.20 and available Food and Non-food Items (FNIs) amounting to ₱409,166,348.15.

#### Standby Funds

A total of ₱245,908,160.62 standby funds in the Central Office and Field Offices. The said amount, ₱199,863,131.43 is the available Quick Response Fund in the CO

### Needs:

## Health

#### Needs:

- Deployment of medical teams at all ports in Regions Mimaropa, V and VIII

#### Responses:

##### DOH Central Office

- Raised Code White Alert
- Issued alert memorandum to all regional offices to actively monitor the following:
  - Weather disturbance
  - Activation of Code Alert and 24/7 Operation Center
  - Preposition of human resources
  - Stockpiling of medicines and medical supplies
- Issued alert memorandum directing affected Regional Offices to deploy standby Emergency Response Teams to provide health services in Seaports
- Continuous monitoring of the weather disturbance through PAGASA
- Deployed two (2) HEMB Staff to NDRRMC Operation Center and Response Cluster in Camp Aguinaldo, Quezon City
- DOH sent Memorandum to all affected regional offices to deploy medical teams to ports in all affected regions

##### DOH Regional Offices

- Raised Code Alert
- Prepositioned assorted medicines, medical supplies, jerry cans, WASH supplies and tents in the provinces through the Provincial DOH Offices
  - Alerted all Provincial DOH Officers to actively monitor and report untoward incident in their respective area of responsibility
  - Rapid Health Assessment Team on standby for immediate deployment
  - Continuous coordination with Provincial DOH Offices (PDOHO), Provincial Health Offices (PHOs), Office of the Civil Defense (OCD), Regional and Local Disaster Risk Reduction Management Councils
  - Rapid Health Assessment (RHA) Teams and public health/emergency response team from different regions are on standby for immediate response should any untoward incident occurs

- Emergency Response Teams (ERTs) are deployed to cater the health needs of the stranded individuals in ports in Regions V, CALABARZON and Mimaropa. Areas of deployment are as follows:

- Coordinated with Regional and Division DRRM coordinators for the validated report on class suspension.
- Deployed three (3) staff in the 24/7 NDRRMC Operation Center.

### General Coordination

Coordination meetings continued daily at the NDRRMC Emergency Response Operations Center (EROC) at Camp General Emilio Aguinaldo, Quezon City. This EROC offers essential services to humanitarian partners, such as internet and workstations.

Reiterating the agreement during the First Meeting on the Activation of the NDRRMC Response Cluster (RC) at EROC on 15 December 2017:

- 1) Each Cluster should have a representative at the EROC on a daily basis on a 24/7 duty.
- 2) **Response Cluster Reports by each RC Member have to be sent not later than 2AM and 2PM** to [dromic@dswd.gov.ph](mailto:dromic@dswd.gov.ph) and [dreamb@dswd.gov.ph](mailto:dreamb@dswd.gov.ph) for consolidation into the NDRRMC Disaster Response Pillar Situation Report, and shall be reported by each Cluster Member during the regular meeting.
