



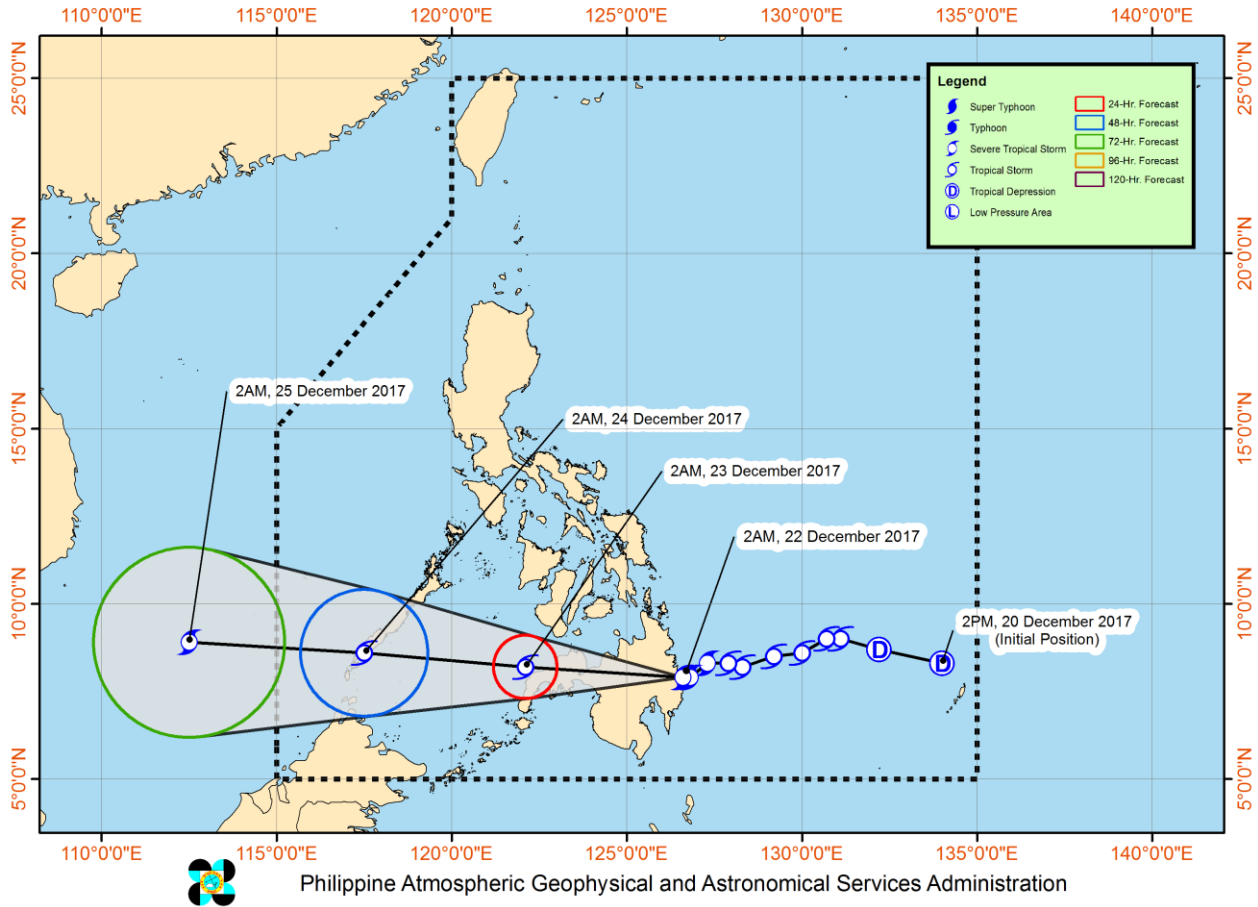
Response Cluster Situation Report No. 1 (as of 22 December 2017, 6:00AM) Tropical Storm “VINTA”

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Situation Overview

Track of Severe Tropical Storm "VINTA" {TEMBIN}



ISSUED AT: 5:00 AM, 22 December 2017

SEVERE TROPICAL STORM "VINTA" IS NOW IN THE VICINITY OF BOSTON, DAVAO ORIENTAL.

- Scattered to widespread moderate to heavy rains will prevail over Visayas and Mindanao within 24 hours. Residents of these areas must make appropriate actions against flooding and landslides, coordinate with their respective local disaster risk reduction and management offices, and continue monitoring for updates.
- Sea travel remains risky over the seaboard of areas under Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal (TCWS).

Camp Coordination and Camp Management & IDP Protection

DSWD

A total of **3,275 families** or **50,882 persons** are currently staying inside **46 evacuation centers** in **Regions X, XI, CARAGA** while **3 families** or **12 persons** are currently staying with families / friends in **Region X**.

Needs:

- Provision of relief assistance to families affected by TS VINTA who are currently staying inside evacuation centers as well as those staying with their families/friends.
- Conduct of assessment and validation for the provision of Psychosocial Support and other assistance for the affected families.
- Assessment on the actual needs of the affected families inside and outside evacuation centers

Responses:

- Provision of Family Food Packs for families inside and outside the evacuation centers
- Coordination with the Health Cluster for possible provision of PSS through the DSWD and DOH Field Offices on affected areas.
- Close coordination of Regional Office Quick Response Teams to Provincial/Local DRRMC to monitor request for any support or augmentation needed related to CCCM.



Food and Non-Food Items

DSWD

Needs:

- Provision of relief assistance in affected areas.

Responses:

- Aside from the updated stockpile and standby funds in the Regional Offices, DSWD – Central office monitors request of affected regions for any support and augmentation for relief assistance operation.
- Validation/monitoring of need/gaps on the provision of relief goods in response to the needs of the affected population for procurement.
- The DSWD Central Office (CO), Field Offices (FOs), and National Resource Operations Center (NROC) have stockpiles and standby funds amounting to ₱590,428,648.97 with breakdown as follows:

Stockpiles

A total of 341,701 Family Food Packs (FFPs) amounting to ₱116,213,839.26 and available Food and Non-food Items (FNIs) amounting to ₱409,497,274.49.

Standby Funds

A total of ₱64,717,535.22 standby funds in the CO and FOs. Of the said amount, ₱17,429,231.43 is the available Quick Response Fund in the CO.



Health

Needs:

- Emergency operations in affected areas to provide quad cluster response which includes medical / public health, water, sanitation and hygiene, nutrition, and mental health and psychosocial services

Responses:

A.DOH Central Office

- Raised Code white;
- Activated Code Alert and 24/7 Operations;

- ERTs on standby and ready to be mobilized and provide health services in seaports;
- Deployed HEMB representative to participate in the PDRA meeting in Camp Aguinaldo, and,
- Ongoing mapping of resources by getting the inventory of assets of the ROs, hospitals, health sectors' partners, and members of the cluster, as directed in the RC meeting on 12/21 @ 2pm.

B. Regional Offices

- Raised code alert;
- Alerted provincial DOH Officers to actively monitor and report any untoward incident in their area of responsibility;
- RHA Team ready for deployment, and
- Continuous coordination with PDOHO, PHOs, OCD, and Regional and Local Disaster Risk Reduction management Council.

GAPS/CONSTRAINTS

- Constraint: Timely receipt of the inventory of resources.



Logistics

OCD

Needs:

- Transportation for the delivery of Food and Non-Food Items to affected regions/areas
- Road and Debris Clearing operations in all affected areas

Responses:

- Coordinated with the following agencies for the availability of resources and transportation assets: AFP - air and land assets PCG - naval vessel BFP - transportation assets Coordinated with OCD Regional Offices X, XI, and CARAGA for the identification of distribution points and logistics warehouses in their respective areas of responsibilities and for identifying their Logistics Officers
- Coordinated with DSWD for the names of their Logistics Officers in Regions X, XI, and CARAGA and identification of available relief items in the DSWD Field Offices.
- Continuous monitoring of road situation.
- Prepared logistics overlay for TS Vinta

GAPS/CONSTRAINTS

- Still need additional details to complete the logistics plan, such as weight capacity of naval vessels and speed of travel, considering the load of the sea vessel and weather conditions.



Emergency Telecommunications

Needs:

- Communication equipment, personnel (Handheld satellite phones, etc)
- Identify areas with no communication

Responses:

- Monitoring of Cellular Phone Signals
- Continuous Deployment of partners at NDRRMC
 - ERIC (NIMS)
 - REACT(Radio Comms HF& VHF)
 - Rappler (Project Agos)
 - PDRF
 - SMART Communications



Search, Rescue and Retrieval

Needs:

- Rescue operations, inspections and survey in the affected areas of TS VINTA

Responses:

- PB340 departed Real Port, Quezon to conduct SRR Opns to MOL 200 passengers of MB Mercraft 3 at vic between Dinahican Port and Polilio Island, Quezon.
- MOL 20 survivor has been monitored to arrive at Dinahican Port onboard fishing boat passing by at the incident area.
- On 1500H, GHQ, AFP directed PAF to provide one (1) SRR Heli to conduct Search and Rescue Operations on the reported sinking vessel.
- The victims of Capsized MV Mercraft III. Five (5) Confirmed dead, three (3) still missing/unaccounted and two hundred fifty-two (252) rescued passengers still to be determined.
- Search Rescue and Retrieval Operations will resume 22 December 2017 morning.

- Coordinated with Regional and Division DRRM coordinators for the validated report on schools used as Evacuation Centers. As of 5 AM, a total of 17 schools used as evacuation centers in Region 10 (4 schools) and Region 12 (13 schools). Of 17 schools, 1 school in Gingoog City, 3 schools in Misamis Oriental, and 13 schools in Compostela Valley. So far, there are 985 families and 3,983 individuals staying in these schools.
- Coordinated with CCCM Cluster for the validated reports on schools used as Evacuation Centers.
- Coordinated with Regional and Division DRRM coordinators for the validated report on class suspension.

- Deployed one (1) staff in the 24/7 NDRRMC Operation Center (8:00 PM to 8:00 AM)

GAP/CONSTRAINTS

- Difficulty in obtaining school data from the affected regions due to the on-going TS Vinta.
