

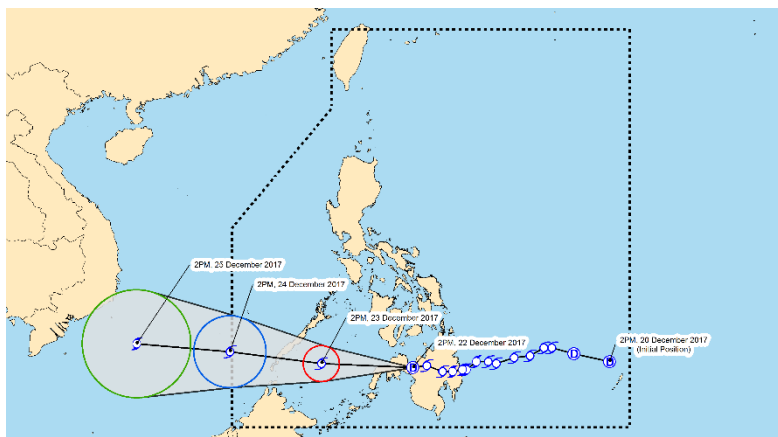

Situation Overview

Situation Overview



At 2:00 AM today, 23 December 2017, "VINTA" HAS INTENSIFIED INTO A TROPICAL STORM AND IS NOW OVER THE SULU SEA.

- Scattered to widespread moderate to heavy rains will prevail over Palawan and Zamboanga Peninsula, while scattered light to moderate with at times heavy rains is expected

over Visayas, Bicol region, and the rest of Mindanao and of MIMAROPA within 24 hours. Residents of these areas must take appropriate actions against flooding and landslides, coordinate with their respective local disaster risk reduction and management offices, and continue monitoring for updates.

- Sea travel remains risky over the seaboard of areas under Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal (TCWS).

Status of Affected Families / Persons

17,925 families or **71,516 persons** are affected in **307 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA, X, XI, and CARAGA** (see Table 1; details in Annex A).

Camp Coordination and Camp Management IDP Protection

DSWD

A total of **12,768 families** or **50,362 persons** are currently staying inside **211 evacuation centers** in **Regions MMAROPA, X, XI, CARAGA**

Needs:

- Provision of relief assistance to families affected by TS VINTA who are currently staying inside evacuation centers as well as those staying with their families/friends.

Responses:

- LGU provided relief assistance to the IDPs in Region Caraga, Region X and Region XI.
- Activation of Regional Quick Response Teams from Regions Caraga, X and XI, MIMAROPA for provision of Technical Assistance and Resource Augmentation to affected Provinces/LGUS
- Close coordination of Regional Office Quick Response Teams to Provincial/Local DRRMC to monitor request for any support or augmentation needed related to CCCM.



Food and Non-Food Items

DSWD

Needs:

- FO X requested augmentation for Ready-to-Eat Food, Plastic Mats and Blankets.

Responses:

- Provision of Plastic Mats (687), Mosquito Nets (2,000) and Blanket (Used:2,335 and New: 146).
- Close coordination with Region affected regions for possible augmentation of FNIs.



Health

Needs:

- Emergency operations in affected areas to provide quad cluster response which includes medical / public health, water, sanitation and hygiene, nutrition, and mental health and psychosocial services.

Responses:**DOH****Central Office**

- D Agency representatives of the Health Cluster were present during the Response Cluster Meeting held at the NDRRMC Conference Room on December 22, 2017 at 4PM
- On going preparation of WASH commodities including water containers, water treatment solution and hygiene kits ready for augmentation to affected regions
- PRC in coordination with DOH has available WASH commodities in Mindanao ready for deployment which include water treatment tanks and water bladders.

PCG

- Medical personnel provided health services to stranded passengers in the ports of Cebu.



Logistics

OCD**“No updates provided by the Cluster members”****Needs:**

- Transportation for the delivery of Food and Non-Food Items to affected regions/areas
- Road and Debris Clearing operations in all affected areas

Responses:

- Coordinated with the following agencies for the availability of resources and transportation assets: AFP - air and land assets PCG - naval vessel BFP - transportation assets Coordinated with OCD Regional Offices X, XI, and CARAGA for the identification of distribution points and logistics warehouses in their respective areas of responsibilities and for identifying their Logistics Officers
- Coordinated with DSWD for the names of their Logistics Officers in Regions X, XI, and CARAGA and identification of available relief items in the DSWD Field Offices.
- Continuous monitoring of road situation.

- Prepared logistics overlay for TS Vinta.

GAPS/CONSTRAINTS

- Still need additional details to complete the logistics plan, such as weight capacity of naval vessels and speed of travel, considering the load of the sea vessel and weather conditions.



Emergency Telecommunications

Responses:

- Thuraya Handheld Satellite Phones are on stand-by.
- Rapid Emergency Telecommunications Team in Regions 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, CARAGA and ARMM are on stand-by.

DICT

12 Dual Band (VHF/UHF) Handheld Radios, 4 Thuraya Satellite Phones and 4 Broadband Global Area Network (BGAN) are on stand-by.

DSWD

- Rapid Emergency Telecommunications Team are on stand-by.
- RETT from Region 12 stationed in Koronadal and Marawi is activated and monitoring situation.
- Done training and turnover of Satellite Phones and manual pointing BGAN usage to DSWD FO 8

CEISSAFP

- Deployed High Frequency Base Radio at the New NDRRM Operations Center

Response:

- Coordinated with Regional and Division DRRM coordinators for the validated report on schools used as Evacuation Centers. As of 2 PM, a total of 38 schools used as evacuation centers of which 25 schools in Region 10 and 13 schools in Region 11. Of 38 schools, 1 school in Malaybalay City, 2 schools in Gingoog City, 17 schools in Misamis Oriental, 5 schools in Cagayan de Oro City, and 13 schools in Compostela Valley. So far, there are 1,453 families and 6,786 individuals staying in these schools.
- Coordinated with CCCM Cluster for the validated reports on schools used as Evacuation Centers for appropriate action.
- Coordinated with Regional and Division DRRM coordinators for the validated report on class suspension.

General Coordination

- Response Cluster Reports by each RC Member have to be uploaded to NDRRMC Information Management System (NIMS) not later than 2AM and 2PM and sent to dreamb@dswd.gov.ph for consolidation.
- *Each Response Cluster Leads shall consolidate all reports of their respective members using the Response Cluster reporting format. (Individual agency report will not be accepted)*
