



Response Cluster Situation Report No. 5 (as of 18 December 2017, 6PM) Tropical Storm “URDUJA”

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Situation Overview

On 12 December 2017, the monitored Low Pressure Area east of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur has developed into a Tropical Depression and was named “Urduja”. It has intensified into a Tropical Storm as it continued to threaten Samar provinces on 14 December 2017.

Food and Non-Food Items

DSWD

The DSWD Central Office (CO), Field Offices (FOs), and National Resource Operations Center (NROC) have stockpiles and standby funds amounting to **₱748,492,650.97** with breakdown as follows:

Stockpiles

A total of 321,048 Family Food Packs (FFPs) amounting to ₱116,948,142.20 and available Food and Non-food Items (FNIs) amounting to ₱409,166,348.15.

Standby Funds

A total of ₱224,166,444.14 standby funds in the Central Office and Field Offices. The said amount, ₱176,333,131.43 is the available Quick Response Fund in the CO.

Needs:

- 8,017 stranded passengers in Regions Mimaropa, V and CARAGA needing of food assistance

Responses:

- Requested the Logistics cluster for the transit of 665 FFPs and 31,500 pouch Ready-to-Eat Food (Arrozcaldo), 10,000 pieces Rice Bar , 1,000 pouch Dry Cereal for Region 8
- Coordinated with RDRRMC VIII responded and provided assistance to the stranded DepEd personnel
- The LGU of Matnog, Sorsogon, Bulan and Pilar continuously provide hot meals three times a day through installation of communication kitchen to stranded families amounting to Php319,565.00.
- DSWD Field Office V provided 1,050 family food packs to stranded families amounting to Php422,100.00.
- DSWD Mimaropa through SWADT in Romblon released two (2) boxes of corned beef, pochero, and laing plus one (1) box of sardines and four (4) of 3-in-1 coffee.



Health

Needs:

- Emergency operations in affected areas to provide quad cluster response which includes medical / public health, water, sanitation and hygiene, nutrition, and mental health and psychosocial services
- Deployment of medical teams at all ports in Regions Mimaropa, V and VIII
- In view of the anticipated shortage of water due to the heavy siltation of water facilities in Tacloban City and nearby municipalities

Responses:

- Continuous monitoring and gathering of information on Health impacts of TD Urduja (ex. Injuries, damage of health facilities, Health Cluster service deliveries)
- DOH RO IV-A CALABARZON mobilized six (6) Emergency Response Teams to the Port of Batangas to provide health services to stranded passengers.
- DOH RO IV-B MIMAROPA mobilized Emergency Response Teams to the ports of the following: Calapan, Roxas, San Jose and Bulalakaw, Oriental Mindoro to provide health services to stranded passengers.

- Coke Foundation, a member of PDRF, is in close coordination with DOH HEMB OpCen and DOH RO VIII with regards to the 480 cases of Wilkins Mineral Water (16 Liters per case). Manila Water, also a member of PDRF, is in close coordination with HEMB OpCen with regards to the 2,000 pcs of 5 Gallons of Bottled Water.
- Emergency Response Teams (ERTs) are deployed to cater the health needs of the stranded individuals in ports in Regions V, CALABARZON and Mimaropa. Areas of deployment are as follows:
- Coordinated to Philippine Red Cross & UNICEF the request for a Water Purification Unit/s and bottled water from PDRF to cover the following areas:
 - Tacloban City
 - Dagami
 - Tabon-tabon
 - Tanauan
 - Tolosa
 - Pastrana
 - Santa Fe
 - Palo
- Twenty-one (21) injured casualties were reported in Region VIII. Thirteen (13) were reported from Tacloban City, five (5) from the province of Leyte and three (3) in Samar. Trauma (16 or 76% of the total consultations) due to falling/flying debris/vehicular accident secondary to bad weather was the common cause of consultations.

Romblon**Responses Undertaken:**

- Coordinated with Regional and Division DRRM coordinators for the validated report on schools used as Evacuation Centers and still are accepting evacuees. As of 12:00 AM, a total of 71 schools were used as evacuation centers across Region 5 (29 schools), Region 6 (1 school), and Region 8 (41 schools); although several of which have already decamped as of 17 December. Of the 29 schools in Region 5, 1 in Tabaco City, 8 in Sorsogon, 12 in Albay, 2 in Legazpi City, 2 in Masbate City, 3 in Sorsogon City, and 1 in Ligao City; of the 41 schools in Region 8, 11 in Eastern Samar, 15 in Samar, 7 in Tacloban City, and 8 in Ormoc City. There's 1 school in Aklan used as an evacuation center.
- Coordinated with Regional and Division DRRM coordinators to validate reported damages, particularly, schools in Regions V and VIII.
- Coordinated with CCCM Cluster for the validated reports on schools used as Evacuation Centers.
- Coordinated with Regional and Division DRRM coordinators for the validated report on class suspension, especially in Region VIII.
- Deployed one (1) staff in the 24/7 NDRRMC Operation Center (8:00 PM to 8:00 AM)

Gaps and Constraints

- In some divisions, though the schools are already identified, we are still working with field coordinators to track the exact numbers of persons, families in schools used as evacuation centers, as well as the number of classrooms, facilities used. And if whether or not the schools are still accepting evacuees.



Law and Order

Responses:

- Deployed one (1) staff in the 24/7 NDRRMC Operation Center (8:00 PM to 8:00 AM)
- All PPOs are directed to secure evacuation centers within their respected AORs and to dispatch WCPC personnel to ensure prevention of crimes against women and children in evacuation centers.
