

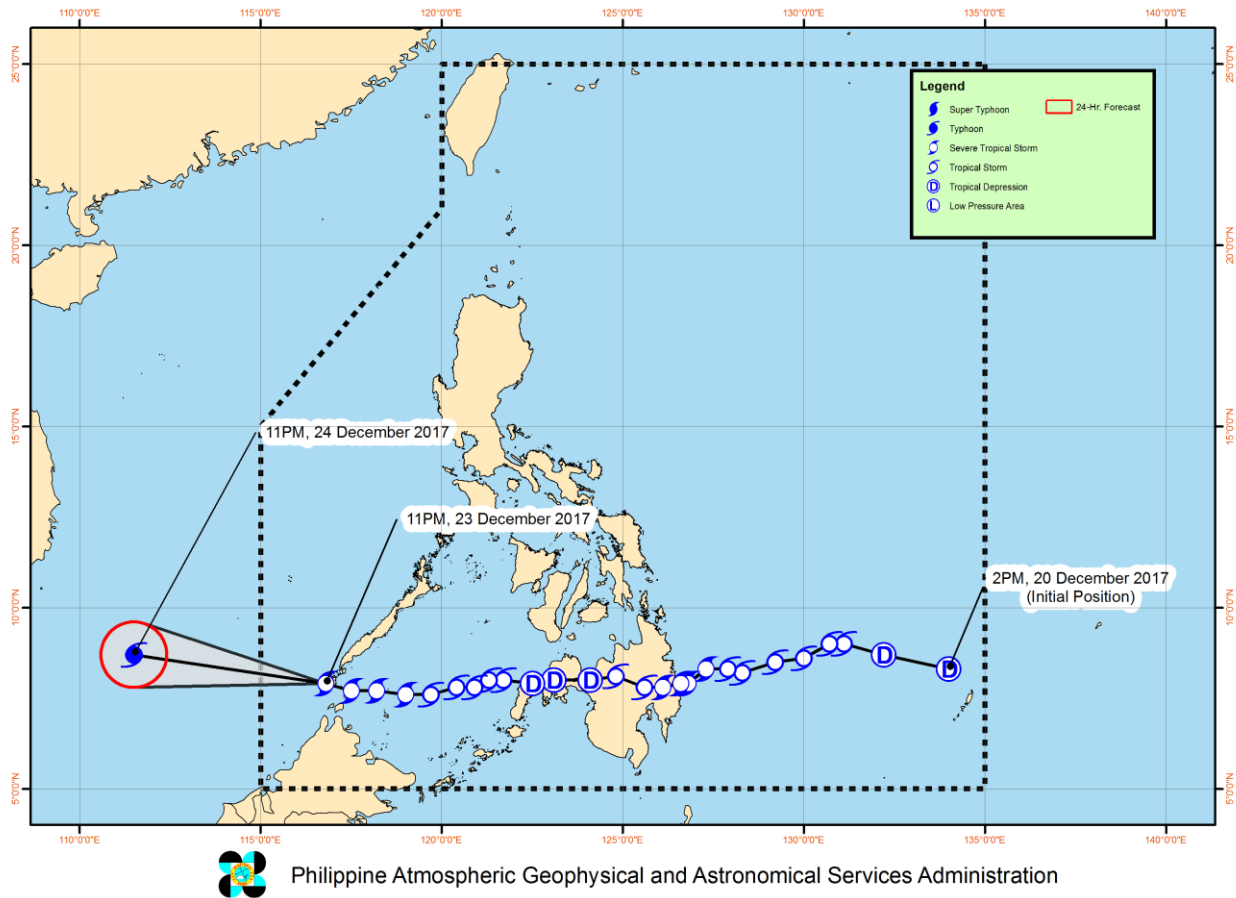

## Situation Overview

### Track of Severe Tropical Storm "VINTA" {TEMBIN}



At 2:00AM today, SEVERE TROPICAL STORM "VINTA" CONTINUES TO INTENSIFY AFTER CROSSING THE SOUTHERN PORTION OF BALABAC ISLAND IN SOUTHERN PALAWAN.

- Scattered to widespread moderate to heavy rains will prevail over Palawan, while scattered light to moderate with at times heavy rains is expected over the western section of Visayas and Mindanao. Residents of these areas must take appropriate actions against flooding and landslides, coordinate with their respective local disaster risk reduction and management offices, and continue monitoring for updates.
- Sea travel remains risky over the seaboard of areas under Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal, the southern seaboard of Mindoro Provinces, and the western seaboard of Zamboanga Peninsula, of Basilan, of Sulu and of Tawi-Tawi due to the Tropical Storm.
- May intensify into a Typhoon before exiting the Philippine Area of Responsibility between this morning and afternoon.

### Status of Affected Families/Persons

**59,580 families** or **268,792 persons** are affected in **518 barangays** in **Regions MMAROPA, VII, IX, X, XI, XII, ARMM and CARAGA** (see Table 1; details in Annex A).

A total of **13,491 families** or **57,768 persons** are currently staying inside **202 evacuation centers** in **Regions MMAROPA, VII, IX, X, XI, and CARAGA** (see Table 2; details in Annex B).

## Camp Coordination and Camp Management IDP Protection

### DSWD

A total of 13,491 families or 57,768 persons are currently staying inside 202 evacuation centers in Regions MMAROPA, VII, IX, X, XI, and CARAGA

#### Needs:

- Provision of relief assistance to families affected by TS VINTA who are currently staying inside evacuation centers as well as those staying with their families/friends.
- Provision of assistance to Marawi IDPs affected by TS Vinta.

#### Responses:

- LGUs provided relief assistance to the IDPs in Region Caraga, Region X and Region XI.
- For Marawi IDPs affected by TS Vinta, the following response actions have been taken:
  - Marawi IDPs who were staying in tents were advised to move out temporarily and stay in school buildings for safety, all in coordination with the LGU LDRRMOs.
    - In Baloi, Lanao del Norte, 99 Marawi IDPs of Balono Evacuation Center is temporarily transferred to Baloi Central School due to damaged tents as a result of heavy winds.
    - In Momongan Learning Center 35 Marawi IDPs are temporarily transferred to Pacalundo Elementary School.
    - Fifteen (15) families staying in tents at Abdulhamid EC has been transferred to the Abdulhamid Madrasah for safety.
  - The Iligan Operation Center has issued directive to all Camp Managers to monitor situation of evacuation camps occupied by IDPs of the Marawi siege 24/7.
- Surigao City are currently serving the remaining 16 stranded passengers, which are currently staying in Mariano Memorial School because the passenger capacity of the vessel is already full. Port operations in Lipata and in Surigao City have already resumed and shipping vessels are now permitted to travel.
- DSWD-FO X has been directed to conduct monitoring inspection in Tubod and Salvador, Lanao del Norte to check on the status and needs of the families affected by flashfloods due to TS Vinta.
- Regional Quick Response Teams from Regions CARAGA, X and XI, MIMAROPA are still activated to provide Technical Assistance and Resource Augmentation to affected Provinces/LGUs and coordinate and monitor request for any support or augmentation needed relative to CCCM and IDP Protection.



## Food and Non-Food Items

### DSWD

#### Needs:

- DSWD-FO X requested augmentation for Ready-to-Eat Food, Plastic Mats and Blankets.

- DSWD Field Offices X and XII requested augmentation of Tents for the Marawi IDPs

**Responses:**

- DSWD Central Office is on process of procuring tents for IDPs.
- DSWD FO 9 is on the process of assessing the request of the LGUs for the augmentation support to the affected families brought about the effects of the said incident in coordination with the SWAD Teamleaders.
- Coordination with the Logistic Cluster for the transport of FNIs to DSWD-FO X on 25 December 2017, [Arrocaldo (14,300), Brown Rice Bar(3,500), Infant Cereal (1,000), Laminated Sack (100), Collapsible Water Container (2,000), Plastic Mats (687), Mosquito Nets (2,000) and Blanket (Used:2,335 and New: 146)]
- DSWD-FO CARAGA extended 500 Family Food Packs amounting to Php 141,900.00 to the affected families in Surigao City.
- DSWD-FO X provided 254 family food packs in respond to the request of the Local Government Unit of Lagonglong, Misamis Oriental
- For Marawi IDPs affected by TS Vinta, the following response actions have been taken:
  - Non-food items like malong, mats, and laminated sacks were provided to internally displaced persons of Marawi Siege currently staying in Lanao del Norte.
- Close coordination with affected regions for possible augmentation of FNIs.

**Gaps**

- A total of thirty (30) tents used by the Marawi IDPs in Lanao del Norte were damaged and needs to be replaced due to TS Vinta.



## Health

**Needs:**

- Emergency operations in affected areas to provide quad cluster response which includes medical / public health, water, sanitation and hygiene, nutrition, and mental health and psychosocial services.

**Responses:****Non Human Logistics**

- Prepositioned logistics worth Php 8,082,115.35 in Regions IV-B, IX, X, XI, XII and CARAGA.

**DOH Regional Offices**

- Continuous coordination, monitoring and validation of casualties
- Coordinated request of Body Bags from OCD IX
- DOH RO XI activated SPEED for disease surveillance.
- Continuous coordination and monitoring with Provincial DOH Offices, Provincial Health Offices, Office of the Civil Defense, Regional and Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils.
- Prepositioned assorted medicines and medical supplies in the provinces through the Provincial DOH Offices.

**Philippine Coast Guard**

- Deployed standby medical team at their District Office in Palawan, Cagayan de Oro, Southwestern Mindanao and Southeastern Mindanao.



## Logistics

### OCD

#### Needs:

- Transportation for the delivery of Food and Non-Food Items to affected regions/areas
- Road and Debris Clearing operations in all affected areas

#### Responses:

- Coordinated with Philippine Airlines (PAL) for possible transport of relief goods in TS Vinta affected areas.
- Coordinated with OJ3, AFP for the transport of relief goods from DSWD-NROC to Laguindingan Airport, Cagayan De Oro, Region 10 on 25 December 2017.
- Continuous monitoring of road situation.
- Prepared logistics overlay for TS Vinta.

- ALL DUTY PERSONNEL ARE ON HEIGHTENED ALERT STATUS in all affected areas.

**AFP**

- Personnel and logistics on standby alert and monitoring.
- Conduct of mobile patrolling, HADR, road clearing, evacuation and rescue and retrieval operations.
- Provision of transportation assistance to evacuees.



- Assisted in relief good distribution for the evacuees.
- Continuous coordination with P/M/CDRRMOs for updates and possible rescue operations.

**Response:**

- Coordinated with Regional and Division DRRM coordinators for the validated report on schools used as Evacuation Centers. As of 12:30 AM, a total of 48 schools used as evacuation centers of which 34 schools in Region 10, 8 schools in Region 11 and 6 schools in CARAGA. So far, there are 1,554 families and 5,725 individuals, including 248 learners, staying in these schools. However, 26 schools have already decamped.
