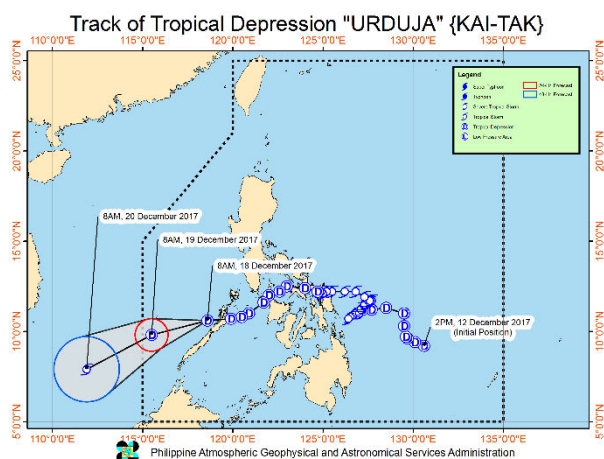

Situation Overview

At 10:00 PM yesterday, the center of Tropical Depression "URDUJA" was estimated based on all available data at 145 km West Northwest of Puerto Princesa City, Palawan (10.2 °N, 117.5 °E).

- Rains due to "Urduja" over Palawan is expected to gradually weaken.
- Sea travel is not advised over the seaboard of Palawan.
- Expected to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) later this morning or afternoon.
- Meanwhile, at 8:00 PM yesterday, the Low Pressure Area outside the PAR was estimated based on all available data at 1,435 km East of Mindanao (6.0°N, 139.1°E). The public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned at advised to continue monitoring for updates regarding this weather disturbance.

Food and Non-Food Items

DSWD

Needs:

- Additional food and non-food assistance to affected families.

Responses:

- DSWD Field Office VIII augmented 37,676 family food packs, 63,852 Malongs and 74,414 Hygiene Kits to the Ty Urduja affected LGUs.
- DSWD Field Office VII is ready to transport 20,000 FFPs to Biliran.
- Logistic Cluster coordinated a shipment for DSWD relief goods 10,000 FFPs, 10,000 pcs Mats, 10,000 pcs Mosquito Nets, 500 pcs Solar Lamps, 31,500 pouch RTE Chicken Arrozcaldo, 10,000 pouch RTE Brown Rice Bar, 1,000 pouch Dry Cereal to sail on Dec. 20, 2017 from Manila to Region VIII.
- OCD to provide 3,804 Family Packs of Non Food Items to be delivered from Manila to Tacloban City, scheduled transport on 20 December 2017
- NROC will produce 200,000 family food packs to augment Field Office VIII.
- The LGU of Matnog, Sorsogon, Bulan and Pilar provided hot meals to stranded families with an amount of Php319,565.00.
- DSWD Field Office V provided 1,050 family food packs to stranded families amounting to Php422,100.00.
- DSWD Mimaropa through SWADT in Romblon released two (2) boxes of corned beef, pochoero, and laing plus one (1) box of sardines and four (4) of 3-in-1 coffee.

Constraints:

- Huge vessel of Phil Navy are not allowed to dock at the Allen Port, Ormoc and Tacloban Port.
- Delivery trucks cannot pass through the damaged road of Samar Provinces.



Health

Needs:

- Emergency operations in affected areas to provide quad cluster response which includes medical / public health, water, sanitation and hygiene, nutrition, and mental health and psychosocial services

Responses:

- Continuous monitoring and gathering of information on Health impacts of TD Urduja (ex. Injuries, damage of health facilities, Health Cluster service deliveries)



Logistics

Responses Undertaken:

- Coordinated with Regional and Division DRRM coordinators for the validated report on schools used as Evacuation Center. As of 12:00 AM, a total of 24 schools are still used as evacuation center of which one (1) school in Region 4B, and 23 schools in Region 8. However, a total of 98 schools have already decamped as of 18 December 2017;
- Coordinated with Regional and Division DRRM coordinators for the validated reports on class suspension as of 18 December 2017;
- Coordinated with CCCM Cluster for the validated reports on schools used as Evacuation Center;
