TROPICAL CYCLONE: WARNING

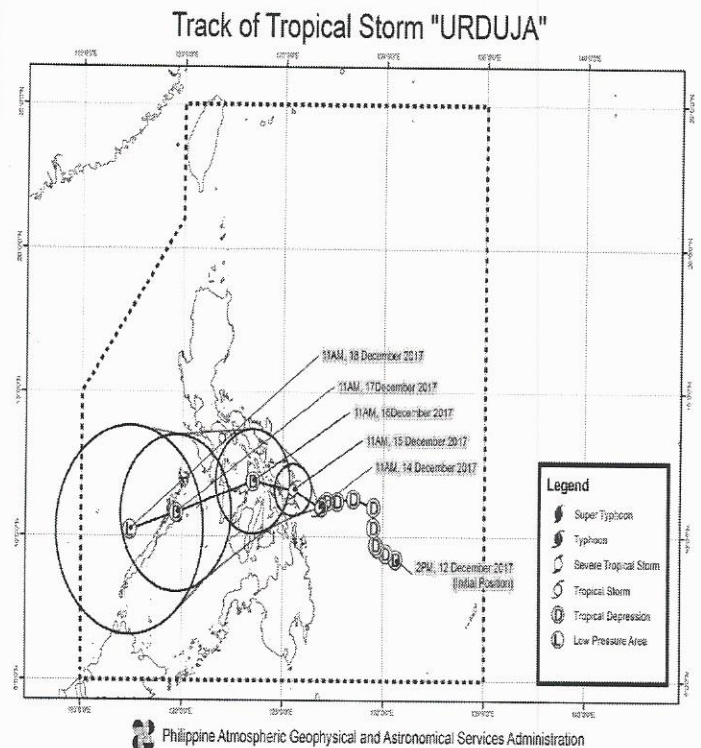
ISSUED AT 2:00 PM, 14 December 2017

(Valid for broadcast until the next bulletin to be issued at 5 PM today)

"URDUJA" HAS INTESIFIED INTO A TROPICAL STORM AS IT CONTINUES TO THREATENS SAMAR PROVINCES.

- Expected to make landfall over Eastern Samar tomorrow morning.
- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 400 km diameter of the Tropical Storm.
- Scattered to widespread rains is expected over Visayas and the regions of Bicol, Caraga and Northern Mindanao within 24 hours. Residents in these areas are alerted against possible flashfloods and landslides.
- Fisherfolks and those with small seacrafts are advised not to venture out over the eastern seaboard of Bicol Region and Eastern Visayas due to moderate to rough seas associated with the approaching Tropical Storm.

Location of eye/center	At 1:00 PM today, the center of Tropical Storm "URDUJA" was estimated based on all available data at 90 km East Southeast of Guiuan, Eastern Samar(10.8°N, 126.5°E).
Strength	Maximum sustained winds of up to 65 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 80 kph.
Forecast Movement	Forecast to move West at 7 kph.
Forecast Positions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 24 Hour (Tomorrow morning): In the vicinity of Borongan City, Eastern Samar(11.6°N, 125.5°E) • 48 Hour (Saturday morning): 90 km East Northeast of Roxas City, Capiz(11.9°N, 123.5°E) • 72 Hour (Sunday morning): 160 km Northeast of Puerto Princesa City, Palawan(10.8°N, 119.7°E) • 96 Hour (Monday morning): 155 km West Northwest of Puerto Princesa City, Palawan(10.2°N, 117.4°E)

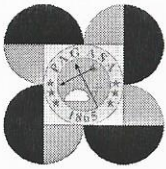

2 (61-120 kph Expected in 24 hours)	-	Eastern Samar, Samar, Biliran,	-	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Light to Moderate damage to high risk structures; • Very light to light damage to medium-risk structures; • No damage to very light damage to low risk structures • Unshielded, old dilapidated schoolhouses, makeshift shanties, and other structures of light materials are partially damaged or unroofed. • A number of nipa and cogon houses may be partially or totally unroofed. • Some old galvanized iron (G.I.) roofs may be peeled or blown off. • Some wooden, old electric posts are tilted or downed. • Some damage to poorly constructed signs/billboards • In general, the winds may bring light to moderate damage to the exposed communities. Most banana plants, a few mango trees, ipil-ipil and similar types of trees are downed or broken. • Some coconut trees may be tilted with few others broken. • Rice and corn may be adversely affected. • Considerable damage to shrubbery and trees with some heavy-foliaged trees blown down.
Wave Height: (Open Sea) 4.1-14.0 meters Storm surge possible at coastal areas

Some banana plants are tilted, a few downed and leaves are generally damaged • Twigs of small trees may be broken. • Rice crops, however, may suffer significant damage when it is in its flowering stage.
